Opening prayer

- A. Call to order by County Judge Executive, John Riley
- B. Roll call by Spencer County Clerk

Roll call by Spencer County Clerk, Lynn Hesselbrock- all present

The Judge wanted to amend the agenda to include under "old business" recycle center hire and to include under "new business" Chief Nation and Chris Limpp to address the issue of roads closed in the County.

The Judge said that he had sent the information out to all of them, on the 11th of February, last Thursday, the Governor issued a declaration of emergency for the State of Kentucky. He came along Friday, and issued a declaration of state of emergency in Spencer County, that was on the 12th. And then the City of Taylorsville issued a declaration of emergency on the 13th, Saturday. He said that obviously, they had been under some pretty severe weather. He also wanted to mention that all of their first responders, the road crews, how much they appreciate Country Mart has always stepped up to the plate, to help the County in any way that they could, and they have offered meals to the road crews, both the state and county, some of them, on the county side, had been at it for a straight twenty-four hours. He wanted everyone to let them know how much they appreciated it.

- C. Approval of minutes from previous meetings
 - Motion made by Esq. Travis, seconded by Esq. Brewer to approve the minutes from the February 1, 2021 Fiscal Court meeting with corrections being made. Discussion ensued. "Ayes" were Judge Riley, Esq. Travis and Esq. Brewer. "Passes" were Esq. J. Moody, Esq. Beaverson and Esq. M. Moody. Motion fails.
- D. Communications from the County Judge Executive

As noted above.

E. Communications from Citizens ***3-minute limit***

There were none.

- F. Communications/reports from members, other offices and committees
 - Zoning readings

Mrs. Sweazy was not currently present on the meeting call.

They will come back to zoning readings.

2. COVID update- Chris Limpp

Mr. Limpp came before the Court and reported that it looked like their numbers were down quite a bit. They were at 55 positive cases in the County. Emergency Management was thankful for the use of the fire house. They gave both rounds of the vaccine to over 400 people in the County. From this point forward any vaccines the Health District gets will be moved to a central location which will be at their office in Shelbyville. This week they had cancelled all their vaccine clinics.

3. Safety committee- Esq. Brewer

There was nothing to report.

4. Solid waste report- Esq. Travis

Esq. Travis reported that he had one recommendation from the Solid waste committee. That was that the Judge order the recycling trailers be placed back out in the eleven different locations. There were seven fire departments throughout the County and four schools. It was weather-permitting; nothing was MARSO 1:00P

going to happen soon. The Judge responded that they were very, very short-handed, going from 10 employees between Parks and Recycling, to now, at essentially three. He was going to recommend hiring another fulltime employee over there and they would be up to four, out of ten. The only way they had been able to keep up with it was to not have to run around the County hauling recycling trailers. He would consider that and asked if the committee had met and decided that and Esq. Travis replied that they had, and it didn't have to be anytime soon. The concrete would be poured when the weather would permit. The Judge said that he wanted to make sure that the contractor had a Spencer County business license.

 - 6. Equipment committee report- Esq. J. Moody
- Esq. J. Moody had something coming up under "old business".
 - 7. Telecommunications committee- Esq. Beaverson

Esq. Beaverson reported that he had some information he wanted to share with the Court. He said that there was a monthly phone bill of \$1680.00 and also a monthly cellphone bill of \$1718.00. Minus the Sheriff, Circuit Clerk, and Judge's office, they had internet bills of \$554.00. He would be talking about some proposals and cost savings later in the meeting. The new telecom system could end up saving them a substantial amount.

Based on these observations the following recommendations are made:

- Conduct a "deep clean" of the building, in particular the clerk staff workstation side of the building. Utilize a microbial disinfectant in the fogger for this cleaning (i.e., Shockwave by Fiberlock and Microban). Deep clean includes: changing air filters, steam clean the carpets, fog the area with an antimicrobial and wipe down all hard services with an antimicrobial.
- Include COVID -19 disinfecting (cleaning and fogging) of the Clerk Administration area on a regular basis. Follow the manufacturers application protocols.
- Implement a preventative maintenance program for the entire HVAC system to ensure system is properly maintained.
- 4. Chase understands partitioning the work area to protect against COVID-19, however the HVAC system may be compromised due to the lack of air movement and circulation.
- 5. Ensure that all returns are clear of obstructions and cleaned on a regular basis.
- Have HVAC trained person assess the current layout of the facility, location of supply and returns and size of the existing units. Ensure that renovations or installment of walls (temporary or permanent) have not compromised the efficiency of the HVAC system.
- Upon completion of these recommendations, Chase is available to collect confirmatory sampling, if necessary or requested.

DECEASED FARM ANIMAL REMOVAL (DAR)



The following guidelines are for the implementation of the Deceased Farm Animal Removal Program (DAR) to aid in the coordination of environmentally sound and cost effective disposal of deceased livestock for county producers.

Questions concerning these guidelines should be directed to the Governor's Office of Agricultural Policy at (502) 564-4627 or govkyagpolicy@ky.gov. Applications to administer this program must be directed through the local County Agricultural Development Council.

- Eligible applicants shall be a county government, conservation district, extension council or other similar entity. A local governmental agency or other eligible applicant must be qualified and willing to fully administer the program on a county-wide, multi-producer service basis.
- Only one application per county per program year will be approved. KADF funding cannot be used to run two programs concurrently. It is the responsibility of the local entity/applicant to be certain that the appropriate stakeholders have been involved in the development of the program.
- Any requests for funds through this program shall be submitted to the local County Agricultural
 Development Council(s) and must receive the county designation of "High Priority" to be considered by
 the state board for final approval.
- An acceptable disposal program may consist of:
 - a. A contract with a licensed entity for disposal of deceased farm animals
 - b. A county-operated animal disposal program
 - c. Incineration; Composting
 - d. Other methods that meet KRS 257.160 requirements for disposal of deceased farm animals
- If the proposal involves the purchase, upkeep, or use of a vehicle to transport deceased animals, provide proof that the appropriate disposal requirements have been met per KRS Chapter 263.
- 6. County agricultural development funding is limited to the lesser of:
 - a. 25 percent of the project's annual budgeted expenditures for the program period;
 - b. \$15,000; or
 - The county's current available Agricultural Development Fund balance.
- Producer monetary contribution for pick-up service is encouraged but is not mandatory.
- Funded participants shall adhere to all local, state, and federal rules and regulations.
 The state level rules can be found in the Kentucky Revised Statutes. KRS 257.160 pertains to the disposition of carcasses and can be found at http://www.lrc.ky.gov/Statutes/statute.aspx?id=12358.

KRS Chapter 263.00 pertains to the transportation and processing of deceased animals and can be found at http://www.frc.ky.gov/kRS/263-00/CHAPTER.HTM. The files making up this Internet version of the Kentucky Revised Statutes do not constitute official text of the statutes but can be used to become familiar with the necessary practices. You are responsible for determining that all necessary practices are in place, even if provided through a subcontractor.

 Standard Kentucky Agricultural Development Fund reporting requirements apply but shall also include programmatic information relating to number and type of animals disposed and a complete, itemized accounting of expenditures.

Per our conversation and site evaluation this is the proposal to perform the following work at Spencer County

Courthouse. The proposal is broken into flooring types and procedures.

Vinyl Tile - Areas are to be stripped with chemical cleaner/ stripper and coated with high solids finish to the areas. There is a total of 740 sq. ft. to have the process performed to @ .80 per ft.

The cost of the tile restoration project is \$592

Terrazzo Entry – A 520 sq. ft. entry had several layers of finish applied. This finish is to be stripped off with a Chemical stripper and abrasive pad and a stone sealer will be applied.

The cost for this portion of the project is \$520

Total Costs for the main court flooring restoration is: \$1112 Additional services such as new areas or carpet cleaning may be added with change orders.

Note: Not included in the cost of the project is the removing of furniture and the reinstallation of the furniture after the restorative process is completed. Also there can't be any foot traffic in the rooms during the restorative process due to slip and fall issues. Stripping Floors can cause damage to painted surfaces such as painted base. This is normal and shall not be covered. Some floors may be loose due to age of the building and moisture. We will do our best to mitigate these issues but can not guarantee all tile will remain in place.

> EXCLUDED: Scraping mud, drywall compound, paint, etc.; removing or disposing of existing flooring materials; moving furniture; providing temporary services (light, heat, etc.); and handling hazardous material (asbestos, etc.) unless specifically noted otherwise within this proposal.

- Motion made by Esq. Beaverson, seconded by Esq. Travis, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, it is hereby ordered to approve the cleaning of the Courthouse floors, as outlined in the above quote at a cost of \$1,112.00.
- Fire Chief Nathan Nation

Chief Nation came before the Court to discuss an incident that had recently occurred. He had sent the Court members emails and videos. He reported that two years ago they were responding to a fire on Hoagland Road and he had an accident and had run off the roadway. The Road department had posted signs saying that the road was closed. The next day, Rumpke was in the area and also tipped a garbage truck. The other night, they responded to an event on Yoder Tipton, near Normandy. The Road department had set signs that the road was closed, but people still travelled them. He said accidents happened and they had to respond. He slid again, but was fortunate to stop before he got to the accident. He said Chris Limpp tried to call the Road foreman and didn't have any luck. Chief Nation remarked that Chris got ahold of him on his cellphone and the Road foreman said nothing much could be done as there were signs up. Chief Nation and Mr. Limpp made the decision to close the road to prevent any other accidents. Chief Nation relayed that he was headed in one direction and Chris Limpp was headed in the other direction and a car came down the road, out of control; their crew had not gotten to the top of the road to block the road. He said it was not working, and his concern was that this was going to lead to more accidents and problems. He said if the roads were to be closed there needed to be some type of physical barrier. Mr. Limpp suggested getting a committee together to look at this; the signs were not working. There were swing away gates that could remain in place permanently and they could close them. He remarked that there were five or six locations. Chief Nation remarked that the roads could be closed and it would not affect any homeowners. Discussion continued. The Judge wanted Chief Nation, Mr. Limpp and the Road foreman to get together and come up with a plan to bring back to the Court.

- 5. Phone system recommendation- KY Tech- Esq. Beaverson
 Esq. Beaverson came before the Court to discuss the upgrades to the current phone system. He reported that KY Tech had been involved in Spencer County since 2005 and came highly recommended. They could put phones on everyone's desks for \$27.00 per month. It was a lease, not a purchase. It would work out to \$1,293.00 per month; we were currently paying \$1,680.00 per month. Esq. Beaverson explained that voice over IP used the internet, and there had to be a certain internet speed in order to do this. Otherwise it did not work well. The fiber that currently went to the Judge's office could be "shared" to allow a better internet connection to facilitate the use of the new phones in other offices. Brittany had shown him the internet bill which was \$1,718.00 per month. He said that they could use the Nextiva app with this phone system, and have those that still needed to use a county phone and import their number to an app on their smart phone, and that would allow them to drop several county phones. Discussion continued with Esq. Beaverson making the recommendation to pursue a contract with KY Tech to upgrade the phone system.
 - Motion made by Esq. Beaverson, seconded by Esq. M. Moody, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, it is hereby ordered to approve the proposal from KY Tech for the phone upgrade for the cost of \$1,293.00 per month.

Background/Summary of Information

The current county phone system is a PBX, non-digital, piecemeal, non-integrated system. The goal is to standardize the telecom system across all departments including the ability to transfer calls to any department and forward incoming calls to cell phones. Cost estimates received gives fiscal court information to decide on moving forward with phone replacement.

The ability to receive incoming calls to a forwarded number is beneficial when individuals are quarantined and still able to work at home. Additionally, office workers in the field often can use an app to answer office calls or receive transferred calls.

AT&T submitted an updated quote and with a new sales team and was interested in upselling other services (fleet management). AT&T offered a new tiered plan which seemed like levels of income for them and unneeded services for the county.

Based on a recommendation from another county official, KY Tech was contacted for a quote. The PVA used KY Tech for IT support since 2005 and a level of trust was developed. After meeting with KY Tech's Brent Taylor and visiting several county offices it was determined the EMS, County Clerk, and possibly the Recycle/Animal Control building need to increase their internet speed prior to installing new phones. The clerk's office may only need a temporary speed increase as they have an adequate connection for deputies. An additional quote for getting downtown county offices on the same network and shared internet connection was requested.

Attached are the updated quotes from AT&T and KY Tech. The recommendation is to proceed with new telecom installation with KY Tech at ~\$27 per phone (38) per month which includes installation and phones (Polycom 450).

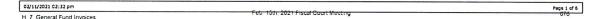
