The meeting was called to order by Spencer County Judge Executive, Scott Travis

B. Roll call

- Motion made by Esq. Eldridge, seconded by Esq. Pharris, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by voice vote, it is hereby ordered to approve the minutes from the February 6, 2023, Fiscal Court meeting with any corrections being made.
- Motion made by Esq. Cotton, seconded by Esq. Eldridge, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by voice vote, it is hereby ordered to approve the minutes from the February 7, 2023, Fiscal Court meeting with any corrections being made.
- Motion made by Esq. Travis, seconded by Esq. Stump with all members of the Court present voting
 "aye" by voice vote, it is hereby ordered to approve the minutes from the February 13, 2023, Fiscal

- D. Communications from County Judge Executive and Magistrates
- 1. The Judge remarked that he had attended several trainings in the past week, and he had learned a new term "age in place". It was just what it says. He remarked that he had asked KIPDA to find out the demographics of our community, and where they lived. He said that we will all have challenges as we got older and family members would have challenges. He said he wanted everyone to know that we had an Extension Office, a Health Department, a Multi-Purpose up on the hill, they had Seven County services, and then they had government offices. He encouraged the audience to reach out if they knew of anyone who had a need. All these agencies were in the service business. Age in place meant people staying healthy enough to age at home. He said that half of KIPDA's staff were devoted to helping people age in place. He said that they were also looking to develop locations where people could vanpool to work locations outside the County.

Be It Further Ordained The road bond on Nevin Lane .127 miles shall remain in effect at 50% for one year. Spencer County Ordinance 14, 2010, Section1, Phase 5 states: The developer will provide the Spencer County Fiscal Court with a bond in the amount of \$160,000 per mile of the subdivision streets for a minimum of 12 months. If any said streets are to be utilized for future construction phases of the subdivision the bond will not be released until their completion. The current bond will be reviewed annually with the county engineer's input.

- 2. Emergency Management-Chris Limpp
 - 1. Hyper Reach update.

Mr. Limpp gave an update on the number of runs his agency had made and how much money they had collected. Mr. Limpp reported that the program was ready and that he, his Chief Deputy, the Judge and Brittany was going to attend training on the system. When they had the training, they would start posting to social media. Discussion on the alert system ensued. No action taken.

2. Paul Edelen resignation.

Mr. Limpp reported that Mr. Edelen had submitted a letter of resignation. His work-life balance was not working. No action taken.

- 3. Safety committee report-Esq. Pharris He had nothing to report.
- 4. Solid waste committee-Esq. Travis

He had nothing to report but said that everybody has noticed that there is trash alongside the roads from Taylorsville to Elk Creek. They couldn't get anybody to pick it up. He wanted to know if there was an update on the two part-time people they were going to hire to do that. The Judge said they could get the folks that they already had to pick up the trash going out towards Elk Creek. Discussion ensued regarding the recruitment of volunteers for trash pickup. No action taken.

5. Veterans committee-Esq. Pharris

Esq. Pharris reminded the Court again about the chili cook-off that would occur on February 25th at the Extension Office at 7:00 pm. He said some may have noticed that some flags were at half-staff and others were not. He signed up for notifications from the Governor's office as to when the flags should be flown at half-staff to avoid confusion in the future. The Judge said that the flags nearest his office were tattered and that new ones were on order. The tree outside his office would have to be trimmed to avoid damaging the flags moving forwards.

6. Equipment committee-Esq. Cotton

Esq. Cotton reported that they had an F-550 that had an issue with the dump bed and it had been repaired and was ready to be picked up today. The Animal Control vehicle had some issues with the transmission and they were working on getting some quotes on that.

7. Telecommunications committee-Esq. Cotton

The Judge had sent a letter of support for Charter Communications and Bardstown Cable so they could seek state funding.

- 8. Administrative Code committee-Corey Thomas
- Mr. Thomas said they would have a second reading of the Ordinance to increase the Judge's discretionary spending from \$1,000.00 to \$3,000.00.
 - 9. Tourism and Economic Development-Esq. Pharris

Esq. Pharris again reported on the wayfinding signs, the dam celebration that was coming up and that they were selling t-shirts. They were going to have a frisbee golf tournament coming up and next year they had a grant for a Tuff Mudder competition.

10. Animal Shelter committee-Esq. Pharris

He said they had made progress on that and continue to check boxes on that.

11. Building and grounds committee- Esq. Eldridge

He had nothing to report. The Judge remarked they had a drainage issue at the Recycling Center. He had asked them to move the coroners van out and it had a temporary tag on it that had expired in March of 2022. It had sat in the barn for nearly a year. He said they cleaned up in there and it looked much bigger now.

12. Parks and Recreation committee-Esq. Stump

13. Farmers Market Pavilion Committee-Esq. Travis

Spencer County, Kentucky Ordinance No. ____ Fiscal Year 2023 Series

An Ordinance to Amend the Spencer County Fiscal Court Administrative Code

Whereas, Kentucky Revised Statute Chapter 68, was created for the purpose of creating a sound and efficient administration of county government; and

Whereas. on December 17.2018 the Fiscal Court of Spencer County, Kentucky adopted the Spencer County Administrative Code, as Ordinance No. 3 (2019 Series) pursuant to and as required by KRS Chapter 68; and

Whereas, the Fiscal Court has determined it necessary to amend the Code to reflect changes in procurement.

Now Therefore Be It Ordained by the Fiscal Court of Spencer County. Commonwealth of Kentucky that:

<u>Section One:</u> Chapter 6 Procurement, is hereby replaced in its entirety, with the following additions:

1. Add Section I: PROCUREMENT

- The County Judge/Executive or his/her designee: shall be responsible for the
 performance and administration or procurement function for county government,
 as set forth in KRS 424.260 and requirements established by the State Local
 Finance Officer.
 - A. Any purchase exceeding \$3,000 shall first receive fiscal court approval.
 - B. Any purchase of less than \$3,000 shall be deemed a small purchase.
 - C. Small purchases shall be made in the open market. Every effort should be made to get the lowest and best price and to share the business among responsible vendors. Quotes are to be taken for most small purchases.
 - D. For all purchases, the Judge/Executive will prepare a three-part purchase order. Copies of the purchase order will be distributed as follows: one for the vendor, one for the agency requesting the items, and one for the Judge/Executive treasurer.

Section II: SEALED BIDDING PROCEDURES

- Sealed bidding procedures shall be followed under the circumstances, conditions, and in the manner as set forth in KRS 424.260.
- The agency, department, official, or person requiring a contract or purchase from county funds not covered by small purchase procedures shall submit to the Judge/Executive a written request containing specifications, quantities, and delivery desired.
- 3. The Judge/Executive shall report the request to the Fiscal Court with a statement of need, the approximate cost and whether the expenditure is provided for in the budget.

- 4. The Fiscal Court shall examine the request and approve or reject it. If the request is approved, the Fiscal Court shall set any evaluation factors to be considered in the bid selection. If any items to be purchased are on State Price Contract, the bid selection process is not necessary.
- 5. The Judge/Executive shall place an appropriate advertisement in the newspaper and shall open all bids publicly at the time and place stated in the advertisement
- The Judge/Executive shall submit all responsive bids to the Fiscal Court shall select the lowest or lowest evaluated bid by a qualified bidder. The Judge/Executive shall notify the bidders of the award.
- The Judge Executive shall sign a contract or issue a purchase order with the one receiving the award.
- 8. Cancellation of any invitation to bid upon a written determination that such action is in the best interest of the county.
- Inspection of the place of business, any operation, and the examination of any financial information of any offeror engaged in the negotiated process with the county: and completion of an audit to be made of any contractor under a negotiated contract.

Section III: PROCEDURES FOR THE PREREQUISITE TO THE USE OF NEGOTIATED PROCUREMENT

- 1. Negotiated procedures may be used under the following circumstances:
 - A. An emergency exists and has so been declared and documented.
 - B. The contract is for professional services.
 - C. All bids received exceed the amount budgeted.



Kentucky Shakespeare had included us as part of their Shakespeare in the Park Spring Series. The city has agreed to waive their permit cost of \$100 and the \$140 fee for setting up and taking down the barricades. We will have a stage set up just outside Fiscal Court door next to the Red Scooter. Main Cross will be closed to traffic from Main Street to Bank Alley from 3ish until about 10:00 p.m.

We are asking the county for two things. We would like the County to cover the cost of two Porta Potties at the cost of \$200 that we are getting from Economy Pest Control in Bardstown. I have talked to Julie Sweazy and Judge Travis about us using Fiscal Court room as a Green Room for the actors. Neither sees a problem with this and Julie tells me the room has been used by other organizations on occasion. I have spoken with Taylorsville Cleaning Service and they are okay with this use and will not charge extra in cleaning fees. 

Whereas the County of _ SPENCER has realized unbudgeted surplus funds/transfers, Be it ordained by the Fiscal Court of County of Spencer, Commonwealth of Kentucky: Section One: The budget for fiscal year __2022-2023 ____ is amended to: A. There were two dozen or more things he came up with, that they could use it for. He thought they should build a building that they could offer as many services as possible. Esq. Travis remarked that he, Esq. Pharris and Mr. Moore came up with an idea to pay for the animal shelter, they buy the land for the pavilion and they pay for the pavilion out of the general fund. And then they borrow 3.1 million dollars from KACO if they could, to supplement that, and that way, at the end, they did not have to use any of their ARPA money for these projects. That would relieve them of all the federal regulations to deal with, with the ARPA money. He said that Jennifer Wilson from KACO, he had asked her that question, and she came back and said they could do that as long as they used that for regular government operations. He said that they could use the ARPA money that they had now, for the general operations of the County and then they could flip it over. He said that if they borrowed the money to do all these projects, and then they used the ARPA money up, they were getting away from deadlines from ARPA, that was put on them to spend it, so there were a lot of good reasons to do this, or at least look at it. They could get it done a whole lot faster. Esq. Stump remarked he thought it was a good idea to get away from all the red tape that slowed everything down. Esq. Travis remarked that the driveway next to the Animal shelter had never been taken care of, it was up in weeds. He wanted it mowed. Corey Thomas sought clarification of who Jennifer Wilson was from, as Esq. Travis said she was with KACO when she was actually from KIPDA.

Fiscal court upgrade the footers and concrete floor to offset the fill of the lot. The fiscal court look into borrowing money from KACO to fund the entire project of the pavilion land and building.

We can borrow the entire amount for the land and building and finance over ten years.

This will free up ARPA money for other projects in the county.

Jim, as we discussed, the county is considering using ARPA funds purchase a 5-acre tract for the construction of a pavilion for approx. \$750,000. Here is what ARPA rules and guidance have to say about this:

-ARPA funds can be used to purchase land and/or build a building.

--Projects funded solely by ARPA do <u>not</u> require a NEPA environmental review (the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) does not apply to ARPA).

--However, projects funded with ARPA may still be subject to NEPA review if they are also funded by other federal funds or have certain federal licensing or registration requirements.

--In addition, aside from ARPA, other applicable federal, state, and local background laws, including environmental and permitting laws and laws about historic preservation (cemeteries, Native American artifacts, etc.), still apply. The engineers and county attorney should advise on whether any of these laws apply to the development of the land and how to comply.

--While ARPA does not require this, the county attorney should perform due diligence on the property and may advise that it is prudent to have a Phase I environmental assessment or other assessment performed as a condition of purchase and include other environmental provisions in the purchase agreement to protect the county -- please check with the county attorney.

--If there is any concern about past hazardous use of the property, the Kentucky Brownfield Redevelopment Program has recently been offering free site assessments – please let me know if you are interested in this (or for any other county-owned property).

-- ARPA requires extensive documentation to be retained for 5 years.

--For the land, please send copies of any studies/assessments, the resolution, the purchase agreement, the deed, and the check.

--The pavilion and other work, if over \$30,000, must be bid out; please send copies of the resolution, newspaper ad, bid documentation, invoices, and checks.

You mentioned that ARPA funds will be used for the construction of the pavilion. If it turns out that ARPA funds do not cover 100% of the cost and you turn to other federal sources, it may turn out that there were steps you should have taken that would mean you would be disqualified from using the other federal funds. If that is a possibility, I recommend waiting to build the pavilion until you are sure of <u>all</u> funding sources and their requirements.
