SPENCER COUNTY FISCAL COURT MONDAY. MAY 17, 2021, 7:00 PM FISCAL COURT MEETING ROOM 28 EAST MAIN STREET

Opening prayer

- A. Call to order by the County Judge Executive
- B. Roll call by the Spencer County Clerk

Roll call by Spencer County Clerk-Lynn Hesselbrock, all present.

Spencer County Judge Executive John Riley said that the Court needed to go back and revisit an issue he thought might be an error at their last meeting regarding the ordinance of a second reading of a zoning reading for the Dollar General store. He said that the County Attorney has done some research on this, Esq. Brewer has, and some of them had. He said that he had believed that in talking with some of them, obviously he had not talked to all of them, he believed that there had been a considerable amount of confusion of this as to what they were actually doing on this. What the motion was, what they intended, he believed that the intention was, of those who voted "no" was that this go back to Planning and Zoning to further review, with regard to building design. He said that certainly building design was not a valid legal basis for denying the zoning. So he thought that they needed to revisit and clarify what they did at the previous meeting. If need be, to rescind that, and move forward from there. So that is why it was unusual he had that on there before they approve their minutes to that meeting in case they called to be changed. The County Attorney remarked that he was not present at that meeting, but as he understood it, it started out with a motion to approve, to get in and start talking about the issues, and then it got going, got going, got going, and then took the vote. He thought that at the time the vote was taken, everybody had in their mind that they were getting this back to Planning and Zoning to have them take a look at look at the issue he mentioned. He agreed, he thought it was just an error in what they thought they were voting on, so he thought that they should rescind any action that was taken on that motion, and they should start over on the thing so that they could get it on the correct term. The County Attorney said that he thought it was tabled, but the Judge said it was not. The Judge said that he thought that the first order of business was to rescind their previous action on that issue, and he said he would entertain a motion to do just that.

• Motion made by Esq. Brewer to rescind the previous motion regarding the zoning of the Dollar General Store. Motion seconded by Esq. Beaverson. Mrs. Sweazy, the Planning Administrator, remarked that she thought that they needed to do the proper verbiage of who the applicant was, and everything. Mrs. Sweazy remarked that was what they were proposing at the location, but the zoning change was for Travis Farms, Inc. for Susan A. Cox. She said that way, they were on the right application and knew what they were doing. The Judge remarked that he wanted the minutes of this meeting to reflect that language. He asked Mrs. Sweazy to repeat that for them; that this was a motion to rescind the action taken in the last meeting on the... he then waited for Mrs. Sweazy to finish the motion. Mrs. Sweazy remarked Travis Farms Inc. for Susan A. Cox. The Judge said that they had a motion and a second on that, and now have some discussion. The Judge said that again, maybe not everyone, but certainly there were some, that on reflecting on what happened, and so forth, feel like maybe, it was an error. That the intention was not to kill the zoning, the intention, in some minds, was that they were sending this back to Planning and Zoning. That's not what the motion was, so, he said they had a motion, and he would recognize anybody who wanted to be recognized on that motion, if not, he would

call for a vote. Esg. M. Moody asked if this just made it like that never happened. The Judge said that essentially they were recognizing an error, by rescinding that action, yes. The Judge asked Esq. M. Moody if his intention was to deny the zoning or to simply to have Planning and Zoning revisit it? Esq. Brewer remarked, or reconsider it. The Judge said if his intention was to deny the zoning, you're fine, you have no problem. Esq. J. Moody remarked that he thought the problem, and he did not know if it had been solved yet or not, he had talked to the County Attorney about it, and that was, the outside material. That was the whole purpose of the thing was to get it up to date, to get away from the concrete buildings. The Judge said that he meant the metal, and Esq. J . Moody replied yes, and put brick down the side. He remarked that now there was a whole bunch of lawyers involved and it all got out of whack. He said that they didn't want to make any waves, and the Judge said, well, we did. Esq. J. Moody replied, well tough. The Judge said, the action that we took, and Esq. J. Moody asked to finish his sentence and was told to go ahead. Esg. J. Moody said that we didn't need that type of building, and the next thing, we would have hoop barns. Esq. J. Moody continued that they just need to drive down Lilly Pike, and a multi- millionaire started moving in, and, he didn't think that he was exaggerating, probably had spent nearly a million dollars on landscaping and straightening out a ditch down there that had looked horrible for years. Then they were putting a metal building not far from there. Esq. J. Moody said that he wanted Dollar Stores in there, and the people around there had lived there all their lives and the Dollar Store is just moving in there. It was not going to cost them that much money, to put brick down the side, and that is the only thing, of the people he represented, objected to. He said the whole thing has gotten out of whack, where two business people would have sat down and had the thing worked out. The County Attorney said that if they were willing to go forward with the second reading, that they were willing to help them out with the brick. The Judge said that was over and above the binding elements that Planning and Zoning had put on it. The Judge said that the action that they did was the second reading, and Esq. J. Moody replied lets go on and get it done. The Judge and Esq. J. Moody continued to discuss the issue with the Judge commenting that they did not have a design committee, or a landscaping committee to look at these issues. The Judge and the County Attorney discussed the need to rescind the past motion with the Judge saying that they needed to do this and the County Attorney remarking that he felt that they could just move forward with a motion to approve the second reading of the zoning change. The Judge remarked he felt that they needed to rescind the error. Discussion continued on what motions needed to be made. Esq. Travis remarked that after they voted to rescind their previous action that they made in error, they could then make a motion to send the zoning application back to Planning and Zoning and ask for brick on the sides of the building. The County Attorney remarked that he didn't think they needed to send it back to Planning and Zoning because Dollar General had agreed to place brick on the sides of the building. Esq. Travis commented that if they agreed to it tonight, he had no problem. Roll call on the motion to rescind the previous motion taken with all members voting "aye", motion passes.

The Judge commented that he didn't know if it would accomplish anything by sending it back to Planning and Zoning. They didn't have a landscape design committee. The Judge remarked that the concession has already been made, from what was said by the County Attorney. The Judge said that they had already gone above, the binding elements of privacy fence, tree plantings, brick panel front, and partial brick sides. The Judge clarified with Esq. J. Moody that they wanted brick panels all

the way down the sides. The Judge remarked that he thought that the applicant had agreed to do that. The Judge said that he would entertain a motion to approve the second reading of the ordinance for, and he asked Mrs. Sweazy to have the language that needed to be in the motion, and Mrs. Sweazy remarked, for Travis Farms, Inc. for Susan A. Cox. She said that the County Attorney might be better able to explain what, she said that if they chose to make a motion to approve, with the binding elements Planning and Zoning agreed to, or that they put in place, with the addition of, that the brick had to be on the sides, that way, it got in the motion, she said that she thought that would probably cover it. She said she would let the County Attorney verify that. She thought that they could add, into their motion. The Judge said that he was going to look to Esq. Brewer to make a motion.

• Motion made by Esq. Brewer to approve the zoning application of Travis Farms Inc. for Susan A. Cox, for the Dollar General Store, based upon the findings of fact of Planning and Zoning, with the addition of the additional binding elements agreed upon to brick all sides of the building to the rear. The Judge added excluding the rear. Motion seconded by Esq. Beaverson. Discussion ensued about the additional binding element and having the attorney for Dollar General speak, the Judge replied no, he would rather not, they were not there to hold a hearing, and the County Attorney advised them to not do this, as a hearing was already held with Planning and Zoning. Roll call vote on the motion taken, all members of the Court present voting "aye".

"aye" by roll call vote, it is hereby ordered to approve the minutes from the May 3, 2021 Fiscal
Court meeting with any corrections being made.

D. Communications from County Judge Executive

1. May 16-22 is Emergency Services Week. There was a proclamation in their packets. The Judge commented that they did have some very dedicated professionals over at EMS and the Judge instructed them to keep them, and all first responders in their thoughts and prayers; they certainly needed it.

- 2. The County will be closed on Memorial Day, May 31st, all County offices will be closed for the Memorial Day holiday.
- 3. The Judge commented that he had appointed Dustin Hedges as Constable for District 1, to fill the vacant Constable position, he has been sworn in. The Judge remarked that he has asked him to work in concert with the Sheriff's department.
- 4. The 2021/2022 budget had its' first reading, and was sent to Frankfort. He had a letter, dated May 13th, approving their budget, so they will get that scheduled for their next meeting, June 7th, to do their second reading. That would give them plenty of time to get that done. He noted that there were going to be three weeks between meetings.
- 5. FEMA projects, they didn't have a lack of things to do; Delta Road, Houghlin Road, Roberts Road, Wilder Road, Edmondson Road. They had bid those out, as a package, and received no bids. He had talked to the Road foreman, and they were talking about acting as their own general contractor on those projects. He said that they had other projects; Little Elk bridge, that was an 80/20 bridge that they were using two years' of incoming bridge money to accomplish that. That will need to be bid out. The Little Crooked Creek project; that will be bid out. The East River Road Bridge will be bid out.
- 6. They were still looking for solid and reliable guidance on the use of ARPA funds.
- 7. Ashlee Ingram is now onboard at Planning and Zoning.
- 8. The Sheriff has finished his project of building a mobile speed limit sign. He encouraged the Court to go over and take a look at it.

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to recognize the value and the accomplishments of emergency medical services providers by designating Emergency Medical Services Week; now



F. Communications/reports from members, other offices and committees.

1. Zoning- Mrs. Julie Sweazy

Mrs. Sweazy had one first reading. No action taken. Mrs. Sweazy wanted to know if anything was put into the budget for Planning and Zoning in regards to their Comprehensive Plan. The Judge remarked that he was not sure, and that they had a fairly sizable reserves for transfer, if need be. He asked how much that would be and Mrs. Sweazy remarked that it was in the minutes of their last meeting that they made a motion that they consider around \$10,000.00 to go towards. She said that they feel that their Comp Plan is a good Comp Plan, but they wanted to go in and upgrade or update the census numbers and things throughout the book and maybe some maps and things that maybe need updated. They were going to try and do the census numbers and plug those in, in house. And then their Chairman, Gordon Deapen, has volunteered to aid in trying to get some of that up to par as well. Then they may have to outsource some mapping as well. Discussion continued on the Comprehensive Plan. Esq. Brewer asked if there was any way they could utilize the televisions when planning issues were brought before Fiscal Court and Mrs. Sweazy replied that she could check in to that. He commented that they used them for their meetings. Mrs. Sweazy remarked that they did, and they were still doing their meetings by Zoom and in person. The Board met in person, and the applicant could be present, but everyone else had to attend by Zoom. She said what she has done, she has prepared a power point presentation, for the whole meeting, and what her Board members are seeing, the people on Zoom are getting to see that same presentation.

2. EMS/EMS director, Chris Limpp

Mr. Limpp came before the Court to give an update on Covid. He said that they would have a clinic to give a booster dose at the EMS building from 3:00-6:00 on May 20th. They will have J&J and Moderna. He also said that he was working on the floodwall recertification.

3. Safety committee- Esq. Brewer

Esq. Brewer reported that he had been in contact with Steve Morrison from KACO about safety training rquirements and that they needed to keep on file. Then, Esq. Brewer planned on talking with each department head to see what they had on file. He said it would probably take a couple of weeks to do that. Esq. Brewer said that they also had an ambulance versus deer incident, there was no damage to the ambulance. They were on a run, and they did hit a deer. The Judge said that he had an incident over at the Recycle center that morning, he just had found out about it. Somebody hit the rail on the overhead door, and bent it. Nobody knows who did it. Esq. Beaverson asked if they were backing up, and the Judge replied that he suspected it was with the Bobcat, and that they were putting on top of

Karen's office, but nobody knows. He said that they did get a hard drive for that video system today and they will be putting that in. If they had had that, he could tell them exactly how it happened, when it happened, and who did it. He said it was minor, but they were going to have to have the door company come out and straighten it out. Esq. Brewer reported that the cameras were up and functional at the ball fields; Brian was happy with the quality. There were some that they put into the Courthouse, that were viewing mostly upstairs, when prisoner transport comes in. They were going to be ordering some more equipment for the hallways downstairs.

4. Solid waste committee

Esq. Travis remarked that he had looked at the rail on the door at the Recycle Center and said that Karen didn't remember hitting the rail. Esq. Travis said that the bracket on the rail was bent and it may have caused the door to come off the track. Esq. Travis also reported that Recycling has three other trailers that they would like to put back out in the community and Karen said that she and Tyler could handle that if the Judge would give the okay to send the other three trailers back out. The Judge remarked that she and Tyler had been working extremely well together, and they were seeing significantly better production now. Esq. Travis remarked that they were just waiting on the Judge to give the okay.

5. Veterans committee

Esq. Brewer reported that on May 29th at 11:00 Am they would be hosting a Veteran's Memorial ceremony out in front of the War Memorial. It will be a renaming of the Post after Clarence Aubrey. Prior to that, will be the Senior graduation parade, so it will be around 11:00. He invited everyone to come out and attend. The guest speaker was going to be Representative Tipton. He was hoping to have a big crowd attend. That weekend, they also would be putting out flags at the cemetery for all the Veterans. He said that there will be plenty of seats for everybody. The Judge remarked that he thought that there were over 1500 Veterans in Spencer County. The Judge remarked that if they knew of a Veteran, to encourage them to get involved with AMVETS. The Judge remarked that the Chamber of Commerce was doing a First Responders lunch on Thursday at Driscoll Estates.

6. Equipment committee report

Esq. J. Moody remarked that everything was fine. The Judge remarked that they got the graphics done on the Animal Control vehicle they got from Metro Louisville. He had just sent the Mayor an email with photographs of it and told him how much he appreciated it. He said that they still needed to get something smaller to replace the Tahoe because they didn't need to be taking that big F-350 out on every little run. The Judge asked about the Coroner's van. Discussion ensued regarding the difficulty getting a vehicle. The Coroner was currently using an ambulance that was not being used by EMS.

7. Telecommunications committee

Esq. Beaverson reported that training was being scheduled for the Nextiva phone system. He remarked that everything else was rolled out. The Judge remarked that the phone system was a few weeks away from going live. Esq. Beaverson remarked that it had been Brittany and Brent who were doing most of the work. The Judge remarked that this meeting was being live streamed on Facebook and then would be converted to U-Tube. Esq. J. Moody said that he had trouble hearing the audio on the videos. The Judge told Esq. J. Moody that the microphone was right above their table, but that was not what they were using. The microphone they were using was on the camera in the rear of the room. Everyone needed to speak up. Esq. Beaverson remarked that it wasn't that the microphone didn't pick up, but rather, the clarity with how someone spoke. Esq. Beaverson said he had talked with Brittany and she relayed that she and Mrs. Sweazy had tested the microphones and they seemed fine if a person spoke

up. Discussion ensued regarding the purchase of microphones with no action being taken.
