D. Communications from County Judge Executive

1. Update on census.

As a whole, the KIPDA region is doing very well, with an average response rate of 74.4%. Placing all of our counties higher than the national average.

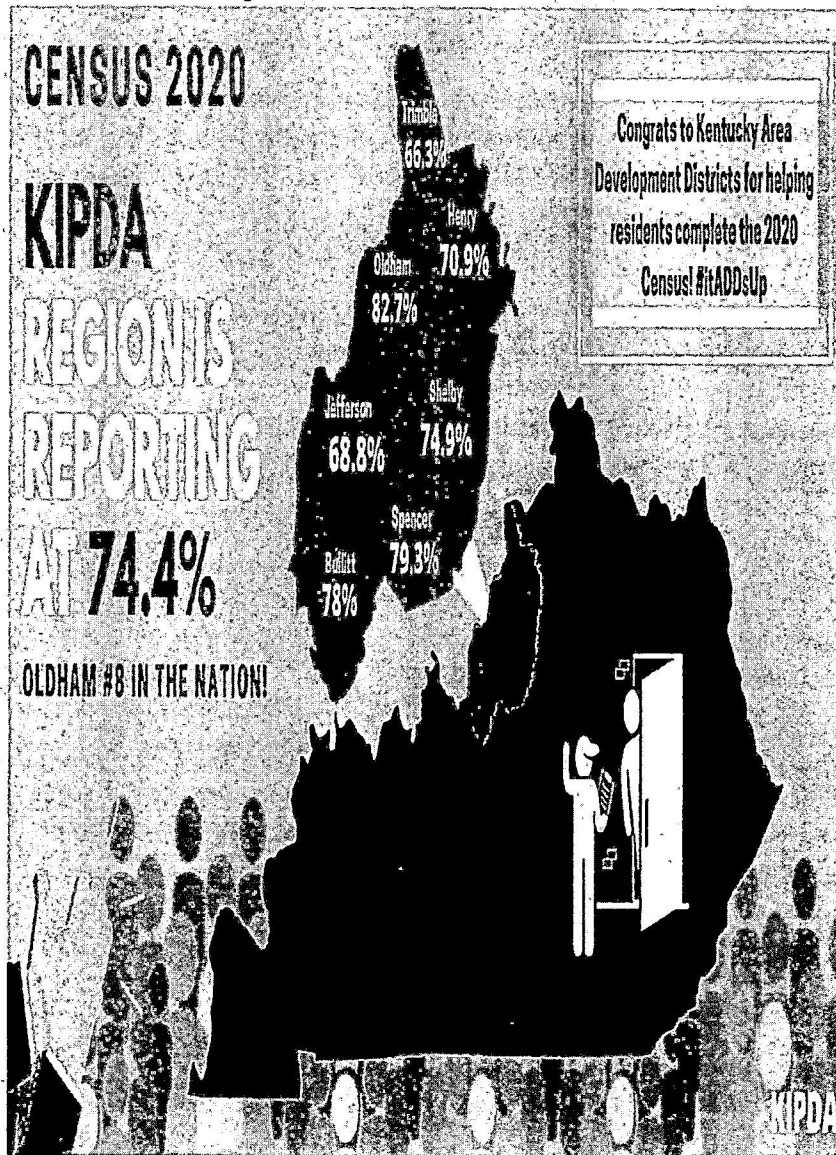
In the KIPDA Region all KIPDA counties are doing great with self-response - all have surpassed their 2010 rate.

2. The Love Lane and Dutchman's Creek projects are nearing completion. Dutchman's Creek might be complete. One was in Esq. Brewer's district and one was in Esq. J. Moody's district.

3. Obviously, the Fiscal Court meetings have been moved to the Web X platform. Obviously, it was going to be an adjustment, but Judge Riley believed it was going to work better for them once everybody was accustomed to it. They had adjusted the meeting agenda, and the Judge has moved, and he knew that Roy Legaspi had asked a question about public comments, he had moved them to the end of the meeting because they had a considerable amount of very important issues that they needed to discuss and business that they needed to take care of, so he had moved that to the end of their meeting so that they could get on and take care of some of the business that they needed to take care of. Esq. Beaverson commented that it was all the more reason to have public comments at the

beginning of the meeting. The Judge replied that would move back, but for this meeting he moved it to the end. They had the 5<sup>th</sup> District, and he didn't want to keep them on forever.

4. Very sad news that the Judge had got, that Judge Executive, Gerry Lynn, from Meade County, had passed away on Sunday. The Judge told everybody to keep his family in their prayers. It was quite a shock and the Judge said that he had tried to introduce most of them to Gerry Lynn at some of the conferences, and he was just a great guy.

**E. Communications/reports from members, other offices and committees**

**1. Kentucky Transportation Cabinet District 5.**

A presentation was made by members of the 5th District Transportation Cabinet members. Mr. Tom Hall said the purpose of the presentation was to have concurrence on the Rural Secondary paving in Spencer County. He said that they started with a budget and then got approval from Fiscal Court for the road projects. They were later in the year due to COVID-19. Last year they did some paving on Plum Ridge Road, Ky 1169. They did some paving on King's Church Road, Ky 1319. They were also asking if the County wanted to use some of the rural secondary paving dollars on paving some local roads. They recognized that Spencer County was using their FLEX funds to do local paving. They had removed that from their available budget to pave state secondary rural routes. Their project work in Spencer County this year is fairly limited; the route they would want to be paving was Ky 1060, Plum Creek Road, from Ky 44 to Ky 1319. That was basically the single resurfacing project that they would like to do, but to supplement that, they would like to do culvert work, and pipe replacements along that route as well. They had provided the TC 20-11 form that provided a discussion on replacement of pipes that would fix some drainage problems. They would then resurface the road. They were asking for questions and concurrence on the project so they could move forward. They wanted the approval either in the meeting minutes or in the form of a resolution. The Judge remarked the work was in Esq. Brewer's district and wanted to know if he wanted to make a motion to go ahead and approve the recommendation. Esq. Brewer asked if they had a time date on when the work would happen. Mr. Hall responded that they did not because all of the state funded paving projects were on hold. They had been receiving far less income from gas tax because of the amount that people were driving so the revenue had been really low. He said that possibly after August, which was traditionally a slow month, paving would commence, when funding became available.

- Motion made by Esq. Brewer that they approve the recommendation of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet on resurfacing Ky 1060 and the necessary drainage pipes issues that are required for repair. Motion seconded by Esq. J. Moody. All members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, motion passes.

Esq. Travis asked if the FLEX funds could be used for repair work other than resurfacing. Mr. Hall responded that certain elements of repair could be eligible. He said that he did not run that program, Craig Caudill at the office of local programs was the decider of eligibility. He suggested Esq. Travis send him an email and he would help facilitate an answer to the question. Esq. Brewer asked if there was an update on the bridge in District 1, and the Judge corrected him saying it was actually District 7, and that the contract had been signed and they were doing everything they could to get that underway, but, they had until next August to complete it, but they were expecting something far in advance of that. Esq. Beaverson remarked that Rep Tipton had been checking on the project and was helping in getting some work done. The Judge asked who else was on the call and Mr. Matt Bullock replied that he was, Mr. Scott Tipton was on the call. Esq. Travis asked the status of the Washburn Lane bridge and was told it would start this week and had a completion date of May 1<sup>st</sup>. Someone made the correction that it would probably not start until November or December.

Dear Judge Riley:

In recent weeks, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the Commonwealth of Kentucky have both issued public health emergency declarations in response to the global pandemic associated with the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). Nationwide, unprecedented actions are being taken. Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear moved aggressively from the start to put Kentucky on a path to flatten the outbreak's curve in the commonwealth and prevent our hospitals from being overwhelmed with sick patients. Until further notice, he has ordered all state buildings closed to the public, directed state agencies to decrease on-site staffing by at least 50 percent, ordered all in-person retail businesses that are not life-sustaining to close, and asked mayors and county judge-executives to monitor people gathering in public places such as parks and stop them if they are not practicing social distancing. He has urged all Kentuckians to keep doing their part by following the rules of social distancing (keeping at least six feet apart from others).

*It was our intention to appear before Spencer County Fiscal Court on Monday, May 4th at 9 a.m. to present recommendations for the 2020-2021 Rural Secondary Program. In light of the circumstances, however, KYTC is respectfully asking to waive the traditional in-person Fiscal Court presentation for this year. In lieu of that, we are asking the court to place this item on the first available Fiscal Court Meeting Agenda, to consider KYTC's RS paving recommendations presented in the attachments and to provide written concurrence or other recommendations as soon as possible. If this approach does not meet the needs of your County, please contact me as soon as possible so we can make other arrangements.*

Enclosed you will find a listing of the recommendations made by the District 5 Maintenance staff and a map indicating the locations of those recommendations. Also enclosed is a list of projects authorized in the 2019-2020 Rural Secondary Program.

As you know, the purpose of meeting with Fiscal Court is to obtain local input regarding maintenance of and improvement to the Rural Secondary Road System. Local input is a very important factor in the determination of priorities for this program and, together with the District recommendations, is considered by the Department of Rural and Municipal Aid in Frankfort as projects are selected for funding. KYTC seeks a written concurrence from the fiscal court in one of two forms. The court can indicate their concurrence or other recommendations through documentation in approved fiscal court meeting minutes. Alternatively, the fiscal court can prepare a court resolution indicating their concurrence or other recommendations. KYTC prefers a resolution as it provides immediate concurrence. This allows us to deliver the annual paving program more efficiently.

Concurrence through fiscal court meeting minutes requires a second meeting, typically an additional month, before the concurrence using minutes are approved.

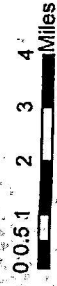
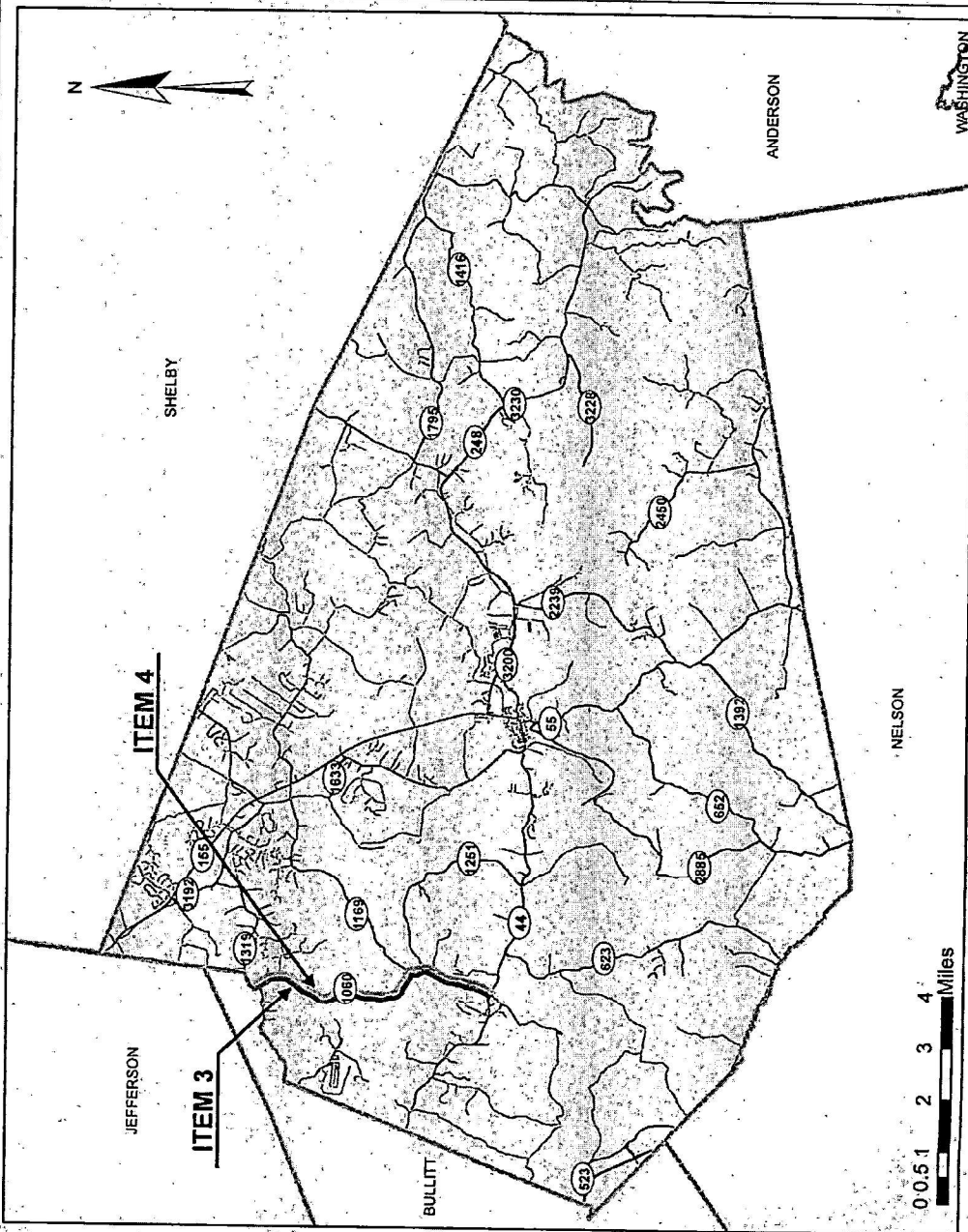

2. Director Chris Limpp, COVID-19 update.

Mr. Limpp remarked that it looked they were due for a COVID update and that the Health Department continued to do weekly testing down there next door to them at EMS. They were seeing pretty steady numbers; they were keeping between 15 and 20 cases in the county each week. They had 2 EMS employees off after an exposure, they were on 14- day quarantine. He said he didn't have any big updates on COVID. The Judge remarked that Mr. Limpp had told him about that yesterday, and that it was going to be a challenge for them, some of the EMS, paramedics, actually, on quarantine.

Mrs. Sweazy said that they had held interviews, they had interviewed about 9 different ladies for her fulltime position and she and the Chairman of the Zoning Board would like to recommend that they hire Angela Helton as their fulltime person at \$15.25 per hour after her drug screening and background check.

Mrs. Sweazy said that she would like Fiscal Court to consider entering into an interlocal agreement with the City for the enforcement of such things as the City's nuisance ordinance. She said that she did give the Mayor an ideal if they split the cost between the City and the County. The Mayor was supposed to talk to the City Council members as well. Mrs. Sweazy continued that since they had the opening right now, it would be a good time if they were going to make the change to make it, to make the enforcement person a fulltime person instead of part time with the agreement that the City was going to kick in to pay that salary and everything. The Judge asked if Mrs. Sweazy had sent the costs to the Mayor and Mrs. Sweazy replied that she had. The Judge remarked that this would be an arrangement similar to what they had with the ABC enforcement with Scot Heath. He is doing that for both the City and the County and the City was paying the County for some of that expense. Mrs. Sweazy remarked that if the Court was not supportive of the idea, she could go on and hold interviews for that part time position as opposed to waiting to try to find fulltime. The Judge asked if it was Mrs. Sweazy's opinion that it was more attractive as a fulltime position versus part time to an applicant. Mrs. Sweazy replied that she had received applications both ways. Esq. Travis asked Mrs. Sweazy if the City paid any of the costs of Planning and Zoning. Mrs. Sweazy replied that they did not, and had not, to her knowledge for 23 years, the length of time she had been there. Mrs. Sweazy said that was something that she had told the Mayor, they would have to kick in to help pay for this person, if they, indeed, considered doing this. Esq. Brewer asked if Mrs. Sweazy knew the percentage, they would be asking the City to pay if they were to enter into an interlocal agreement and Mrs. Sweazy replied that she thought they had figured it up as half. She said that right now, they were just considering a part time person and if they wanted them to do their stuff, they were going to have to be half. Mrs. Sweazy was asked if she knew what that number was and she replied that Doug had sent that information to her. Esq. Brewer asked if it would require another vehicle and Mrs. Sweazy replied that she thought the person could use the existing vehicle, as they would need to be in the office a certain number of days to talk to customers about any letters they had been sent. Discussion then began about the days the person would be in the office and that the person would be used as an occupational tax enforcement person for the County. Mrs. Sweazy said if they did a 40 hour week, at \$15.25 an hour, they were at \$31,720.00 and adding in retirement match and social security, FEBCO and things of that nature, that gets you up to \$42,632.81, if they divided that out by 12 months, that would be \$3,552.73 and if they split that with the City, that would be \$1776.36 each, per month. Those were the numbers that Doug had given her. The Judge wanted to know what direction the Court wanted to go in. Esq. Travis remarked that he thought the City Commissioners would need to know the same information that had been given the Court and he thought that they were not quite ready to tackle this right now. The Judge said that they could tackle it from the standpoint of, if it's something that's desirable for the Court, that they would like to pursue, they didn't want to negotiate with the City and then come back and say, no, we want to do part time for only the County. So, they were trying to basically see which direction the Court would like to go. Did they want to negotiate something with the City and share that person, or, did they want just want to hire a part time person to do the County stuff only. Esq. Travis said that he thought that it would be a good idea to get the City involved with this because the Solid Waste Committee had been talking with the City for the last several months, and their whole theme was to get the City and County more

involved with one another, instead of being divided, and he thought this would be a good way to do that, to help the City and County work closer together. Mrs. Sweazy interjected that she had talked to the Mayor, giving him this information. She knew that they had a City Council meeting yesterday, she didn't know if he had brought it up at the meeting or not, she had not heard back from him this morning. Esq. Travis said that he had been at the meeting and the Mayor had not brought it up while he was there. Mrs. Sweazy remarked that she didn't know if it was something they would bring up in regular session or if they might bring it up in executive session. Mrs. Sweazy continued that it was something that if they decided to pursue it, the Court wouldn't drag their feet on it. If it was going to be something that would take forever to find out about, then she would just go ahead and do her part time person, to be honest. She needed to get somebody back on top of those things and not let them linger.

- Motion made by Esq. Brewer, seconded by Esq. Travis, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, it is hereby ordered to continue to work on Inter Government agreement between Spencer County and the City of Taylorsville to hire a full time person for both entities to work as the Code Enforcer for Spencer County Planning and Zoning as well as for the City of Taylorsville. This person would also work as the Code Enforcer for Spencer County Occupational Tax office.

The Judge said it looked like they had solid support for moving in that direction and Julie wanted them to move forward as quickly as possible and he would do whatever he could to help the process and of course Ken would be working on the actual interlocal agreement, something they could bring back to the Court if they found some agreement with the City. The Judge wanted to know if there was anything else from Mrs. Sweazy. Mrs. Sweazy said that was all she had. The Judge wanted to know about her vehicles, did they need to get Esq. J. Moody to take a look at their vehicles and see where they were on equipment for her. Mrs. Sweazy replied that honestly, it wouldn't be a bad idea. The Tahoe that they had had some age to it, and it had some issues. The Judge said they would get the equipment committee on that. Mrs. Sweazy said that she wanted to say that she was there by herself, and when she got off the meeting, she was going to close the office to go do some addressing. She had about 15 addresses that she had to get done that she had been putting off for two weeks, so. So that way, if anybody got to looking for her, the office was going to be closed for a while today.

4. Sheriff Scott Herndon- Equipment/Raegan House sale

Sheriff Herndon came before the Court to update them on the sale of the property out at Wilsonville. He said that he had inherited the situation from a previous administration.

**Per Judge Riley:**

**Sheriff Herndon gave an update on the sale of the seized property located on Wilsonville Road. Distribution of the proceeds of the sale have not yet been determined. Proceeds distributed to the Spencer County Sheriff's Office will be deposited into the Sheriff's State Forfeited Property account. He discussed possible uses for these funds such as body cams, binoculars and patrol rifles for each vehicle. The sheriff will continue to keep Fiscal Court posted.**

**Sheriff Herndon also talked about his plan to obtain accreditation for the Sheriff's Office.**

No action taken.

5. Safety committee report- Esq. Brewer

Nothing to report.

6. Solid waste committee- Esq. Travis

Esq. Travis reported that he and Esq. Brewer had been working on the getting specifications for the solicitation of a contract for the hauling of residential solid waste for the City and the County. Steve Biven had graciously donated his time to write up these specifications. Esq. Travis had them in front of him. He met with the City Council the previous evening and they gave their blessing. He didn't know if the Court needed to vote on it, but it was ready to be advertised in the paper. The Judge remarked that they did not have that in front of them. He went on that in the interest of time in getting it advertised.



Esq. Travis said that he could send all the members of the Court the specifications by email and they could look them over to see if there were any changes. They only had 3 ½ months left before the contract was due and they were going to have to have a bid meeting with all the people who are interested before the contract is signed and let them give their input.

- Motion made by Judge Riley, seconded by Esq. Travis, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, it is hereby ordered to bid the garbage pickup contract based on the recommendations of the Solid Waste Committee.

Esq. Travis went onto say the contract was basically the same as the current one; there was a clause added that dealt with curbside pickup, as a separate service. It would be voluntary and if enough people signed up to make it profitable, it would be a service that could be offered.

7. Veterans committee- Esq Brewer

The Veterans committee has been requested to help another organization do a cleanup of Little Mount Church Cemetery. There is a Revolutionary War grave located there. This will take place on Saturday at 9:00 am. Anyone interested can contact Lee Higginbotham, President of AMVETS. Judge Riley commented that Esq. Brewer had brought up to him the naming of bridges, that would be in honor of someone, for example, a Veteran or whatever. He said that it would really depend on if it was a County or State bridge. They had done that in the past, the new bridge over Salt River here in town was done in memory of C.L. Glasscock, so that was something they could look into in the future.

8. Equipment committee- Esq. J. Moody


Esq. J. Moody reported that the Jailer's vehicle was supposed to be done that morning. It was coming back from All State Ford. Esq. J Moody asked for clarification regarding the Sheriff's vehicles. The Judge responded that Esq. J. Moody was to get with the Sheriff and come up with a recommendation, and also Planning and Zoning, and anybody else who needs vehicles. He would be happy to meet with them also. Esq. J Moody also commented that he had some complaints regarding sewer odors on Overlook Road. The Judge instructed Esq. J Moody to get with him on that and they would dive into that and see, maybe with the Corps of Engineers to determine what that might be. It was difficult to hear Esq. J. Moody and the Judge said they would move on to Telecommunications committee.

9. Telecommunication committee

Judge Riley said that Esq. Beaverson was working on the phone system upgrade. Judge Riley was going to call a special meeting next week with the Perfection Group to discuss the County phone system. Esq. Beaverson remarked what he had, and what had worked best was AT&T. He said he had a cover letter that did not make it into the packet that said the current phone system was PBX, not digital. The goal was to standardize the system across all departments. This included the ability to transfer calls to any department, and forward incoming calls to cell phones. Cost estimates received gives Fiscal Court information to decide on moving forward with a bid or use state contract pricing. It would be beneficial to have the ability to forward calls for employees who were quarantined at home. Esq. Beaverson stated he did not know if the Judge had anymore information, but he questioned if they might be able to use at least some of the CARES funds. Esq. Beaverson said he would like to know if the Court wanted him to pursue this with AT&T. The Judge said they needed to move forward as the phone system was antiquated. He said the Court was probably not ready to make a decision at this time. The Judge continued discussion regarding the phone system with Esq. Beaverson saying he wasn't looking for the Court to make a decision, he only wanted to know if the Court wanted him to pursue options for a new phone system. The Judge said that he definitely thought it should be pursued and it would be interesting to see what the Perfection Group was proposing. Esq. Travis asked if the new phone system could be integrated into a new Court house and the Judge replied it could. Es. Beaverson said they needed to keep in mind that they had a lot of satellite buildings, so it was just not the Courthouse. It was decided to pursue a new phone system.

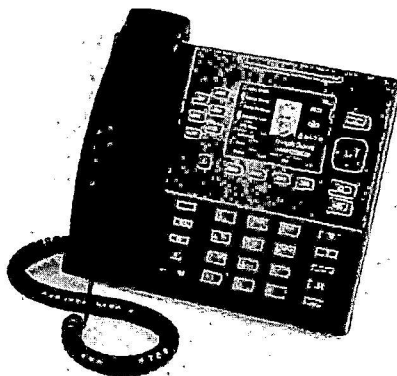

**G. New business**

1. Parks equipment- Esq. J. Moody informed the Court that he had spent considerable time on this with the Parks. They had looked at several options, including buying a tractor which would cost

around \$45,000.00. The best option, in his opinion, was to purchase 2 SKAG Turf Tiger mowers for a cost of \$12,265.64 each.

- Motion made by Esq. J. Moody, seconded by Esq. M. Moody, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, except Esq. Travis, who voted "nay", it is hereby ordered to approve the purchase of 2 SKAG Turf Tiger mowers at a cost of \$12,265.64 each, or a total of \$24,531.28.

Esq. Travis questioned the purchase this late in the mowing season and said that he would like to look at contracting out the mowing to a private company next year and eliminate the mowing by the Parks Department altogether. He thought that it would be a cheaper route and they could probably eliminate one fulltime position at the Parks Department altogether and save money there also. Esq. J. Moody remarked that they need to sell the Ford pick up truck, and Gary Day's Explorer as well. The Judge said they would put it on the agenda for another day, and Esq. J. Moody replied that they had been putting it on the agenda for a long time and they couldn't let the junk pile up but needed to do whatever was needed to get rid of it. The Judge wanted him and Brittany and himself to get together and get a plan on how they were going to proceed. Esq. Travis asked Esq. J. Moody to look into the possibility of replacing the Recycling Centers vehicle with one of the new 2500's that they bought for the Parks Department. The Judge said that was off of their agenda and to put that on another agenda.

2. emergency radios

The Judge said that he needed to adjust the recommendation that he had. He said that the quote from J&N was for 3 radios, but the Sheriff needed an additional radio, so the quote needed to be adjusted to 4 radios.

- Motion made by Judge Riley that they purchase 3 Kenwood TK-5210 radios from Sunny Communications for \$825.00. Motion seconded by Esq. Beaverson.  
Esq. Brewer stated that he had asked Doug several times about the rebate that they were supposed to receive on the last radios and the Treasurer had sent him an email stating that was included in the price that they purchased the last time when they bought the bulk of them, and he did not believe that was correct. He believed that they were supposed to receive the rebate after they paid for the radios. Esq. Travis asked if these were used units, and it was confirmed that they were. Esq. J. Moody asked for Esq. Brewer's opinion on the radio purchase and Esq. Brewer remarked that he had no idea, every time they turned around, they were asking for more radios. He was not sure why they had not ordered all the radios the first time and this was the third time that they were ordering radios. Esq. Brewer said he didn't know how many radios they needed or how many radios that they had. Esq. Brewer asked who the radios would be going to and the Judge replied that one would be going to the Animal Control office, the Coroner needed one, and he didn't know who the third one was for. They weren't just buying radios to be buying radios. Esq. Travis said that one was going to one of the Jailer's deputies, but the Judge wasn't sure.

Mr. Chris Limpp came before the Court to ask that they approve the purchase of power lift cots and power load systems to replace the current manual cots and loading system. What he wanted to do was to use CARES money they had just received for EMS salaries and roll that money into purchasing these power cots and power load systems. He said that his goal was to reduce exposure to COVID and reduce the possibility of moving and lifting injuries. He said these were in the 10- year plan he had given them several months ago, was to retrofit their fleet. He had the Stryker representative in his office if they had any questions. Esq. Travis commented that there were two different quoters in their packets; one for 84 and one for 77, he asked if they added the two together. Mr. Limpp replied that he thought the total came out to \$166,000.00. He said the reimbursement was \$177,000.00 for salaries. Mr. Limpp stated that total was \$166,930.00 with installation. Esq. Travis asked in the event that they purchased a new ambulance, would the new power lifters be able to go with the new ambulances, and Mr. Limpp said that was correct. Esq. Beaverson asked if they had purchased new stretchers withing the last year and Mr. Limpp replied that they had not purchased a new stretcher in a number of years. The Stryker representative informed Mr. Limpp that it was in 2016. He said that they had 3 stretchers that were 12 years old and one that was a 2016 model. Mr. Limpp said that the Court had discussed purchasing a stretcher for the Coroner's van last year. Esq. Travis asked if they could use CARES money to purchase an ambulance and Mr. Limpp replied that they could not. The Judge asked what counties surrounding Spencer County had not yet converted to the power cots. Mr. Limpp said that we were the only county in the area who had not changed to the power system.

• Motion made by Esq. Travis, seconded by Esq. Brewer, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, except Esq. M. Moody and Esq. J. Moody, who voted "nay" it is hereby ordered to approve spending up to \$167,000.00 to purchase power cots and power loaders, including installation.

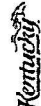

5. Jailer Melvin Gore a. new hires  
 Mr. Gore came before the Court to ask for approval to hire two new deputies as his two deputies have resigned. Mr. Gore said that he had already had a drug screen and background check done on one person he had in mind, as he was a previous County employee, he worked for EMS. His name is Aaron Hornsby. The other was Tommy Mc Gaughey, a background check or drug screen has not been done.

The Judge asked for a written letter of resignation from Jerry Davis, and asked if Pricilla, a former deputy jailer, had been terminated. Mr. Gore said that she was not, but had resigned. Judge Riley asked for a letter of verbal resignation from her as well. Mr. Gore said that he had retrieved her equipment. Judge Riley said that the question came up early on about Court Security officers transporting newly arrested prisoners and that they had requested an opinion from the Attorney General's office about this. In the packet there was a letter, and the Judge said that the President of the Sheriff's Association disagreed with the opinion that Court Security officers could not transport newly arrested prisoners. Judge Riley said that he hoped Mr. Gore was using Court Security to transport newly arrested prisoners. Jailer Gore said that he was not using them, but was doing it all by himself since July 5<sup>th</sup>. Jailer said that KACO, which was the County's legal system, say no, they could not, Ken Jones agreed, the Jailer's Association says they cannot. The Jailer said that in addition, in order for him to transport, he needed to do a 40-hour training and deputy jailers had to do a 24-hour certification. Jailer Gore said he did not know why this was being brought up again because the Sheriff's Court Security did not want to do any night work. The County Attorney said they were still deferring to the Attorney General in interpreting those statutes. Discussion continued with no action being taken. The Judge said he would leave it up to the Court to decide what to do. The Jailer's recommendation was to hire two new deputies and his recommendation was to wait until they got an opinion from the Attorney General to see if they could use Court Security officers to transport prisoners. Judge Riley said that he thought the Sheriff would be willing to work with the Jailer. Esq. Brewer asked the Jailer if he had retrieved the equipment back from Pricilla after she quit and the Jailer confirmed that he had. Discussion regarding what equipment could be re-used for any new hires ensued.

- Motion made by Esq. J. moody, seconded by Esq. M. Moody, with all members of the Court present voting "aye" by roll call vote, except Judge Riley, who voted "nay" it is hereby ordered to approve the hire of two new deputy jailers and to approve the equipment purchase supplied by the Jailer.

Dear Assistant Attorney General Iaccarino:

This is in response to your correspondence addressed to Jerry Wagner, in his capacity as Executive Director of the Kentucky Sheriffs Association, pertaining to the authorizations of Court Security Officers ("CSOs") in KRS 70.280 to transport prisoners, and any limitations on such authority. Your inquiry arises from a request for an Attorney General's opinion by Hon. John Riley, Spencer County Judge Executive, as to whether there are any limitations on a CSOs authority to transport prisoners. Specifically, Judge Executive Riley states that the new Spencer County Jailer has taken the position that CSOs may transport prisoners only in connection with Court proceedings, and not upon initial arrest or in any other transfer between facilities.

Spencer County does not operate a jail. It is our understanding that the transportation plan required by KRS 441.510(4) implemented by the Fiscal Court designates prisoner transports to the Sheriff, Deputies, and CSOs. According to County Judge Executive John Riley, the Spencer County Jailer objects to transportation by the CSOs, and instead seeks funding for new positions for Deputy Jailers to conduct such transport duties.

Prior to 2007, court security was primarily provided by Sheriffs and their appointed certified Deputies, who had full law enforcement authority. In a few counties, non-certified personnel with little training were utilized as bailiffs. In its 2007 Regular Session, the Kentucky General Assembly enacted SB 153, creating the position of CSO. While the Kentucky Acts recites no specific legislative intent for SB 153, it is evident that the amendments to KRS Chapters 15 and 70 sought to provide increased security to the Court system, while not overburdening the budgetary and personnel constraints facing Sheriffs and other law enforcement agencies. With the enactment of SB 153, CSOs were authorized and assigned to provide court facility security services, and overburdened Deputies who were certified law enforcement officers

could shift their focus on maintaining public order and safety in the community.

Effectively, SB 153 created a hybrid of the Deputy and bailiff in order to transition properly trained and equipped officers into a role that not only provides the necessary heightened and extended courtroom security but also possesses the valuable capability to transport heightened and extended courtroom security but also possesses the valuable capability to transport heightened and extended courtroom security but also possesses the valuable capability to transport heightened and extended courtroom security. The implementation of CSOs has alleviated the impact on both budgeting and staffing constraints on Sheriffs by removing the need to employ or otherwise call upon full time law enforcement officers for security or transporting purposes. Not only did the legislature add new transporting responsibilities to court security staff duties, but it also added new qualification and certification requirements in response to the increasing demands on CSOs.

CSOs are appointed by the Sheriff and serve at the pleasure of the Sheriff. The CSO receives specialized training under KRS 15.3975 that is somewhat less rigorous than Deputies, but which still requires upwards of 80 hours of law enforcement training, and must also meet the minimum qualifications as set forth in KRS 15.3971 involving an extensive background investigation which includes passing a drug test, psychological evaluation, and polygraph examination.

Section 1 of 70.280 lists the authorized activities of CSOs. Specifically, the CSO is charged with attending court sessions, keeping order in the courts, providing court security services within the court facility or the immediate area, guarding prisoners during appearances, serving warrants or civil service of process on individuals physically present in the courtroom, *transporting prisoners*, and arresting and taking individuals into custody who are in the court facility or "*while transporting prisoners*." SEE KRS 70.280(1)(a-h)(emphasis added).

Conversely, KRS 70.280(2) limits the authority of CSOs by prohibiting the arrest of individuals outside the immediate vicinity of the Court, unless such arrest occurs while the CSO is transporting prisoners. KRS 70.280(2)(a). Subsection 2 of KRS 70.280 further prohibits a CSO from other basic law enforcement duties, such as patrolling the highways or issuing citations. SEE KRS 70.280(2)(b-d). KRS 15.442 prohibits a CSO from being a Deputy Sheriff, thereby providing another statutory reiteration that CSOs shall not perform general law enforcement duties that exceed authority provided in subsection 1 of KRS 70.280. Finally, KRS 70.140 limits a CSO to only providing security services to any court of the Court of Justice, but specifically but not to the Fiscal Courts.

In light of this statutory overview, to address the inquiry posed by Judge Executive Riley, CSOs are indeed limited to the provision of security services in the Court facility or the immediate vicinity thereof. However, the one exception to this limitation is when the CSO is transporting prisoners. In most of the subsections creating the CSOs' authority, the CSO is only authorized to act in and around the Court facility. SEE KRS 70.280(1)(a, b, c, d, e, and h). However, when KRS 70.280(1)(f) authorizes CSOs to transport prisoners, the grant of authority is without

limitation whatsoever as to time, place, or circumstances of transport. The authorization for CSOs to transport prisoners whether or not in connection with a Court proceeding is further clarified by the wording of KRS 70.280(1)(g), by granting arrest authority to CSOs not only within the Court facility, but also "while transporting prisoners."

"The most logical and effective manner by which to determine the intent of the legislature is simply to analyze the plain meaning of the statutory language." *Stephenson v. Woodward*, 182 S.W.3d 162, 169-70 (Ky. 2005). Here, a plain reading of the language of KRS 70.280 does not lead one to the conclusion that the General Assembly intended to somehow limit the transportation authority of CSOs. Instead, an overall reading of the plain language of KRS 70.280 leads to the unmistakable conclusion that the General Assembly intended instead to limit the law enforcement powers of CSOs, except when acting within the Court facility or in the process of transporting prisoners.

While the CSO was clearly contemplated by the legislature to assist in the often burdensome task of transporting prisoners, the Kentucky Sheriffs Association also wants to emphasize that the Sheriff, whether utilizing a CSO or a Deputy, is not responsible for all prisoner transports. There are often circumstances in which the Jailer is required to transport prisoners; whether directed by the Fiscal Court pursuant to KRS 441.510 as mentioned, if ordered by the Court (KRS 70.130), or upon the Jailer deeming such transportation necessary (KRS 441.510(7)). Fortunately, the CSO may be properly utilized as a means to balance the needs and demands of transports for both Sheriffs and Jailers.

6. Election update- County Clerk, Lynn Hesselbrock  
The County Clerk came before the Court to update them on the general election. She read a statement and requested action on some items needing immediate attention.

GENERAL ELECTION – NOVEMBER 3, 2020

As we approach the 2020 Presidential general election, there are several factors that will need to be considered in planning and conducting this election.

The first is the approval of 31 KAR 4:192E, or the emergency administrative regulation approved by the State Board of Elections which will determine how the election will be conducted in every county. Many of the provisions of this administrative regulation have changed existing statute, and the way they we, as a Board of Elections, have used as guidelines to conduct elections in the past.

The main focus in the 2020 primary election was the promotion of mail in ballots. In a "normal" presidential election, we would process around 100 mail in ballots. In our past primary election, we processed 3,500 mail in ballots, or around 70% of the total votes cast in the primary election in Spencer County. This was an enormous increase in time, man hours, and expense. Our turnout for the primary election was a little over 31%, and we expect that we will easily see 70-80% turnout for the general election. We most likely will process between 8,000 and 11,000 mail in ballots.

The web portal to request a mail in ballot has been open since August 24<sup>th</sup>, and we currently have around 900 ballot requests in the "que". Ballots have not yet been printed and we will not receive any ballots until mid-September. I imagine that we will have double or triple the number of ballot requests by then. This is the reason for the ballot processing committee; the Board of Elections has appointed 8 people to this committee and are requesting that their rate of pay be approved today. We will also need to rent space in the Chamber building again, as we did in the primary election. I have the rental agreement awaiting approval today.

The next major change to the election process is the concept of no excuse "early voting". The emergency regulation mandates that we, as a county, provide early voting at a minimum, from October 13<sup>th</sup> through November 2<sup>nd</sup>. In addition, we are mandated to provide voting hours on 3 Saturdays prior to election day. This will be October 17<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>. The hours must be from 8:00 am until 12 noon each Saturday. This is an added expense to counties, but may be partially reimbursed at some point in time. We will receive twice the reimbursement for personnel expenses as we received in the primary election, or around \$15,500.00.

Our current plan is to have two early voting locations to give more voters the opportunity to vote early, and to try to reduce congestion, crowding, and exposure to COVID on election day. We will have a location in downtown Taylorsville, the same location that we used for the primary, and we are planning on having a location in Elk Creek, possibly having later hours there to accommodate voters coming home from work. Both of these locations will need to be staffed the same way a normal "precinct" would be staffed, and this is one of the items we have requested action on today. We will need 12 people to staff these locations, 8 regular Precinct Election Officers, and 4 alternates.

Another major change in the election will be election day itself. In past elections voters could go to their local "precinct" to cast their vote. While we are being asked to greatly reduce the number of precincts on election day to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19, we are also being asked to open more than one voting location.

In addition, before we can finalize plans for recruitment, training, and placement of precinct officers to staff our polling locations, our "election day plan" must first be approved by the Governor, the Secretary of State and the State Board of Elections. It is our hope that this is done with expediency so that we can have the necessary time to arrange everything necessary to conduct an election. All polling locations must, by statute, be staffed by a bipartisan group of Precinct workers, and while this has been challenging in the past, and will be even more difficult this election. Training is still mandatory, and



finding a way to train both the workers who want in-person training and those workers who would prefer virtual training is another obstacle we will need to overcome. Many of the volunteers for this election have never worked an election in the past, and it will require extra time and effort to train them. Additional training on the use of Epollbooks will be necessary as paper rosters will not be allowed. Having Precinct Officers trained to distribute ballots according to "ballot face" rather than precinct is something that has not done in prior elections.

Our initial "plan" although not officially approved yet, will provide 3 polling locations on election day, but I am not at liberty to make those locations public until we receive approval. We have taken into account the geography of the county as well as the population density of our voters to help to ensure every voter has a voting location that is accessible to them.

We are mandated to have at least one of these precincts serve as a "countywide voting center" which means that any voter in any precinct in Spencer County will be able to cast their vote in this location. To reduce even more confusion and frustration than this election has already caused, our initial plan is to make all 3 voting locations "countywide voting centers" to allow any voter to cast their ballot in any location. This will add some expense to the election costs, as each location will have to have to be supplied with each ballot face. We have 8 "ballot faces" in this election. This will require purchasing more ballots, adding to the cost of the election.

Because we initially will have to place postage on every outgoing ballot, I am asking for additional postage, exclusively for mail in ballot use. This will be reimbursed, but I will need the postage added to my meter, now, not later.

Due to the many changes in the election process, we must make sure that voters have the information that they need to be able to be aware of the voting times, locations, and all of their voting options. This will require that we advertise more than we have in previous elections. In the primary election, we took out 2 full page ads and a half page ad in our local newspaper, only to have citizens voice frustration over not being aware of their voting options. The KCCA has asked the State Board of Elections to assist counties with "getting the word out" to voters, but in addition, I am asking for funds to advertise on Froggy radio as well as placing advertisements in the newspaper. The advertising costs are reasonable, and the radio station has a very large presence in our area. In addition, I will be taking out inexpensive advertisements on Face Book to help reduce the overflow of misinformation that seems to be present there. I have already begun to print out flyers for the "early voting" location here in town, and those are being placed around several spots in our community and on social media. I am also asking for funds to have 2 double sided 4x4 signs printed to alert voters to the early voting locations, both in town, and in Elk Creek.

I think that it is evident that we will need to be able to move quickly and to be able to have supplies delivered to locations quickly and without delay, since we really do not know at this time what to expect. That is the reason I am asking that I have the ability to ask for assistance from the Parks department for short periods of time, without having to wait on authorization to do so. I will certainly make the Judge's office aware as soon and as quickly as possible if I need their assistance, but oftentimes, help is only needed for less than 30 minutes, and delays can be avoided if prior approval is not required.

I think that these are our most pressing needs at this time. I am sure that things will change during the course of this election, but I am confident that this Court is eager to facilitate our citizen's ability to cast their vote in this most important, and very unconventional, election.



H. Communications from Citizens \*\*\*3-minute limit\*\*\*

1. Mr. Roy Legaspi

Mr. Legaspi came before the Court and wanted his words on the record. He said that he understood that he got three minutes, whether it was at the beginning of the meeting or at the end of the meeting. He said that it made no difference but that people really needed to be there and he was speaking to them as well as the constituents. He said that he thought it was a miscalculated request to move the comments from the citizens of this County to circumvent certain things that have happened in the press recently in regards to the Judge Executive's office. As far as the phone system, phone systems are expensive. When you move a phone system, its very expensive. He encouraged all of the Magistrates to look at the phone system and calculate the cost of moving the phone system form an old building to a new building whether it be refurbished or not. That was an expense to the County that they did not need. He said he would admonish the Magistrates to make sure they had a complete RFP for the phone system because it is so expensive and that they distribute it out, not only in the paper but in several papers so that they got multiple bids and get the best system. AT&T sometimes isn't always the best system. As far as the renovation of the Court building, Oldham County is currently going through the system, and they do not have any County employees in the Court building and the Administrative Office of the Court will assume all expenses as far as the renovation of the historical Court building in Oldham County, he suggested the Magistrates look into that. He will be communicating with them in moving the County offices out of the building to a separate office. Finally, the EMS department continues to spend money, continues to use the 24- hour employee. He went on to say, we pay them for sleeping, we also have increased our expenses at the EMS department and nobody is looking at auditing the employee hourly rates, the hourly working hours, no one is looking at auditing the expenses, we continue to spend. He continued that they need to look at outsourcing the EMS department and stop this bleeding. The expenses are out of control, and we just rubber stamped another \$200,000.00. He thanked them for allowing him to speak.


