Opening prayer

- A. Pledge of allegiance to the U.S. and Kentucky flags

The meeting was called to order by County Judge Executive, John Riley

- C. Roll call by Spencer County Clerk, Lynn Hesselbrock- all present
- D. Approval of the minutes from previous meetings
 - Motion made by Esq. Beaverson, seconded by Esq. M. Moody, with all members present voting "aye", it is hereby ordered to approve the minutes from the December 16, 2019 Fiscal Court meeting with any corrections being made.
- E. Communications from citizens***3- minute limit***
- 1. Mr. Roy Legaspi came before the Court and asked for his comments to be part of the minutes. Mr. Legaspi thanked the Magistrates. He said that there had been many challenges the past year and many decisions that had to be made. He said that although he did not agree with every decision they had made, he respected the work that they had done the past year on behalf of the county and the taxpayers. He asked them to continue to question the expenses of the county and not approve expenses they did not understand. He remarked that these magistrates have asked questions when the previous magistrates had not. He said that when they had information, they had the power to make good decisions. He said that the issue of the floodwall remained unresolved, and he thought that the residents who benefitted by the floodwall should bear the expense of the floodwall. He did not believe that the County residents should be paying for the floodwall. He again thanked the magistrates.
- 2. Mr. Carl Darnell came before the Court to say that the 2nd amendment sanctuary resolution was on the agenda for the Court today and he felt that was a good idea, although it had no legal standing in court. It was a right to speak up as a county and as an individual. He said that if they did not like the 1st or 2nd amendment, they should vote "no".

- 1. The asbestos has been removed from the old EMS house on Spears Drive. The Road department will be doing the demolition work within the next 2-3 weeks.
- 2. Painting is being done at the Courthouse and the Annex. Still need to look at replacing some flooring.

Fleet Mechanic: Letter of opinion

I wanted to relay a message about our fleet of vehicles. I'm very concerned about the mileage and age of our fleet.

The Parks Departments vehicles show a substantial amount of wear. The best vehicle has 220,000 miles and has a significant amount of rust. This vehicle consistently hauls 3 men, a trailer and multiple movers/tractors.

The Building Superintendents vehicle is 4 cylinder, 5 speed with over 170,000 miles and is not capable of hauling anything other than light tools.

Currently, we have a Deputy at the Sheriffs Office using a 2007 Crown Vic with over 180,000 miles. Many of our ambulances also have 140-150k miles. I contacted the local governments in Shelby, Nelson, Bullitt, and Jefferson county as well as the Kentucky State Police Frankfort fleet mechanic to compare their vehicle replacement schedules. While the schedules varied from county to county, not one of the administrations that I contacted used any vehicles over 150 k for first responder

As the mechanic in charge of these vehicles I can only continue to maintain them to the best of my ability. I am concerned that the vehicles are becoming unsafe for county employees as they continue to age and deteriorate.

There was nothing to report.

Jailer

The Jailer came before the Court to tell them that he had spoken to some of the magistrates and he had 3 concerns. The first was that he wanted a radio. He said that he had told the Judge that he needed three radios. The Judge asked him if he and the deputy jailers could share and he had agreed. He said that he really needed a third radio because he had a female deputy out at night. He said that she went to the hospital with the patients and sharing a radio was rough. He said that another issue was that he had three officers and had on issued weapon, and one officer was using their own weapon, so he needed two more weapons. He said that one of his officers was carrying her own 380, and that it would

shoot you but it would not knock you down or would not stop you, and the whole purpose was to stop. The third issue was vehicles. His truck had 186,000 miles. He took it to have the transmission repaired because it was still under warranty, but he had not had any problems in the last 3 days. He has another vehicle he obtained from the Sheriff, but he wanted to replace his vehicle, and keep the truck in his department so he would have a second vehicle for his officers. He wanted the radio situation resolved as soon as possible. He said that there was a radio in the Judge's offices that was marked for the Coroner's deputy, and the Judge commented it was for the Coroner to which the Jailer responded "she needs two radios?". Discussion ensued with the Judge recommending that the Jailer and the other departments determine how many more radios they needed and then order them. The Judge asked if anyone wanted to look at the radio needs for the county and Esq. Brewer said he would do so. The Sheriff said he wanted to issue a radio to each of his special deputies, but agreed to lend the Jailer a radio until more could be ordered. Discussion continued.

9. Esq. Beaverson

The Judge recognized Esq. Beaverson to speak. Esq. Beaverson relayed that the Teenage Republicans were going to have a regional banquet and meeting on January 25th at 6:00 pm at Claudia Sanders Restaurant. Several elected officials were scheduled to speak at the event. Tickets were \$25.00 each and he had tickets.

Based on an Asbestos Survey Report prepared by Air Source Technology, Inc. and dated September 10, 2019, asbestos containing materials were found at the referenced location. Specifically, approximately 900 SF of 9" floor tile and associated mastic found in certain areas of the building.

On December 23, 2019, Larkin Environmental Solutions, Inc. removed asbestos containing materials from the building by utilizing non-friable methods in accordance with current asbestos regulations.

Therefore, all known asbestos containing materials identified in the Asbestos Survey Report have been removed and disposed of in a proper manner.

The waste was transported to the Hardin County Landfill for disposal and a tracking document will be provided for your use.

Everyone:

On 1/2/2020, at the request of County Road Foreman Todd Burch, an inspection of Watkins Glen Way Phase 1 roadway was performed. The purpose of the inspection was to determine if the roadway work in phase 1 is complete to the satisfaction of Spencer County such that the developers bond can be released. During the site visit I witnessed approximately 12 areas of various sizes that were remediated South of 600 Watkins Glenn Way. Foreman Burch advised that he was present during the pavement repair work and all was done to his satisfaction. Based upon my observations and conversation with Foreman Burch, we recommend this phase to be considered complete.

Discussion ensued regarding a new vehicle for the Parks Department. Esq. J. Moody remarked that he could buy a new vehicle for less than he could buy a used one. Esq. Travis recommended purchasing three new trucks instead of one. One for the Parks department, one for Recycling and one for the Jailer. They could then give their vehicles to other departments. Discussion continued with Esq. J. Moody outlining the specific vehicle needs for various departments. Esq. J. Moody questioned the assertion that an ambulance with 150,000 miles was unsafe. He also said that getting information late on Friday afternoon did not give him enough time to do research like he would like to do. Discussion continued.

 present voting "aye", except Esq. Beaverson who voted "nay", it is hereby ordered to approve
 the expenditure of \$24,826.52 for a truck for the Parks department from Bill Collins Ford.
- Motion made by Esq. M. Moody, seconded by Esq. Brewer, with all members of the Court
 present voting "aye", it is hereby ordered to transfer \$25,000.00 from account # 019200999
 (reserves for transfer) to account 015401592 (parks vehicles).

Esq. J. Moody asked for direction from the Court on how to move forward with researching new and used vehicles for the jailer. The jailer spoke up and detailed what his needs were for a new vehicle. Discussion continued with no further action being taken.

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2. Resolution #7 in support of the right to keep and bear arms.

Esq. Beaverson explained that there was a push across Kentucky to approve resolutions in support of 2nd amendment rights. He was aware that the resolution had no legal standing, but was a message to the lawmakers who have pre-filed some "gun grabbing" bills. He said that our own Representative said the bill would not make it out of committee, but the point was the "gun grabbing" bills have been filed to test the waters. He read the summary of Bill request 342.

Motion made by Esq. Brewer seconded by Esq. Beaverson, with all members of the Court

Whereas, Fiscal Court opposes the filing and potential passage of any legislation by the Kentucky General Assembly to restrict the Individual right of US Citizens as protected by the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution, including

Whereas, the Right of the People to Keep and Bear Arms is guaranteed as an Individual Right under the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and under the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and;

Whereas, enactment of such bills places unconstitutional burdens on law enforcement officials and citizens in a manner which could jeopardize life, liberty, and property and;

Whereas, the People of Spencer County. Kentucky, derive economic benefit from all sales and forms of firearms use in recreation, hunting, and shooting conducted within Spencer County using all types of firearms allowable under the United States Constitution;

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, by the Fiscal Court of Spencer County, Commonwealth of Kentucky, that the Court opposes the filing and any enactment of legislation that would infringe upon the right of the People to keep and bear arms and consider such laws unconstitutional and beyond lawful legislative authority.

Be It Further Resolved, that the Spencer County Fiscal Court demands the Kentucky General Assembly cease further actions restricting the right of the People to keep and bear arms and hereby demand the Governor of Kentucky veto all such legislation which restricts the right of the People to keep and bear arms.

Be It Further Resolved, Spencer County declares itself a "sanctuary county" for all firearms unconstitutionally prohibited by the government of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

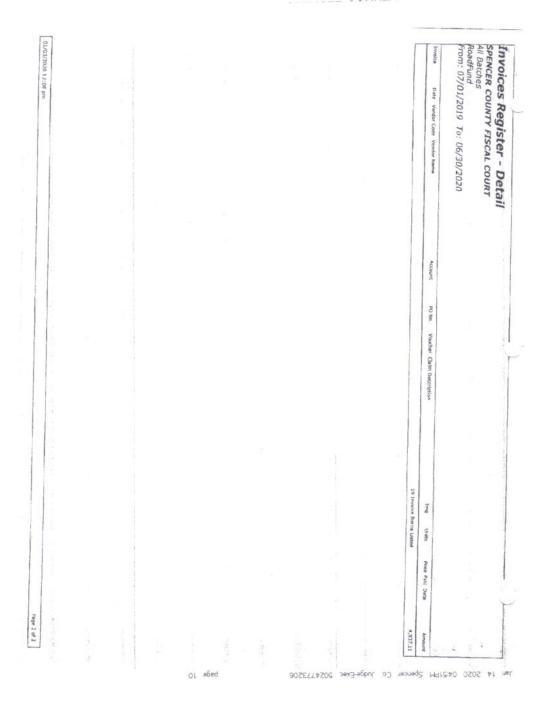
