A. Call to order

The meeting was called to order by County Judge Executive, John Riley.

B. Roll call

Roll call by Spencer County Clerk, Lynn Hesselbrock- all present.

- C. Review and approval of minutes from the previous meeting
 - Motion made by Esq. Brewer, seconded by Esq. Beaverson, with all members present voting
 "aye", by roll call vote, it is hereby ordered to approve the minutes from the March 16, 2020
 Fiscal Court meeting with any corrections being made.
- D. Communications from citizens *** removed for this meeting***
- E. Communications from the County Judge Executive
- 1. This is a historic point in Kentucky history. Spencer County Fiscal Court is conducting their first electronic meeting over the internet via the 'ZOOM" platform. Citizens comments have been removed from the agenda but are welcome to speak with any Fiscal Court member at any time. Magistrate Beaverson was thanked for his work arranging the "ZOOM" meeting for Fiscal Court. The COVID-19 is an historic health event. This week is designated "National Public Health Week" There are 3 cases reported in Spencer County. Two of those cases have been released from isolation. There has been one death reported in Shelby County.
- 2. All county offices continue to work; however, they are closed to the public. Friday it was announced that the County Clerk's office would be closed for at least two weeks.
- 3. The Road Department is working on the many FEMA projects from the 2018 FEMA event as well as preparing for mowing season. They have completed the projects on Highway to Heaven, Greer Road, and are expected to complete the Stevens Farm road project today. There are some projects that are out for bid. Progress has been made on the bridge on Plum Ridge Road and started on the Featherbed Hollow bridge replacement.
- 3. By proclamation the Judge has declared the month of April Child Abuse prevention month. Also, by proclamation, the Judge has declared April 3rd, Spencer County Arbor day.
- 4. Med 4 had a problem with the water pump and the Judge had ordered the repairs be done for \$2,373.00 by Bob Hook Chevrolet. The Judge wanted Fiscal Court to ratify his decision to order that the work be done.
 - Motion made by Esq. J. Moody, seconded by Esq. Brewer, with all members of the Court voting
 "aye" by roll call vote, it is hereby ordered to ratify the Judge's order to have repairs done to
 Med 4 in the amount of \$2,373.00.
 - 5. The Judge said he had intended to get the budget to the Magistrates by April 1st, but he said that they had had a few distractions, and he intended to get the budget to them well in advance of the May 1st deadline.

2. Chris Limpp- update on COVID-19

Chris Limpp said that there were 3 confirmed cases in Spencer County and all 3 were considered recovered. EMS has put into policy the screening of their employees twice a day. The policy is more stringent than the Health Commission. If an EMS employee has a temperature of 100.0 or higher, they must be off work for 7 days after the fever resolves. Employees are screened at 7 am and 7 pm. All EMS employees are wearing either a reusable N-95 or P-100 masks. Most of the masks were donated by Jim Williams Body Shop. They are continuing to track PPE that comes in and that they distribute. They distributed 1200 masks to Signature on Friday. Esq. Brewer asked Chris Limpp if he was seeing an increase in ambulance runs over the last two or three weeks than they would normally. Chris Limpp stated that call volume seemed to be a little lower than normal other than calls related to these symptoms. They were stating to see more calls for that. He thought that they had made a run this morning around 6:00 am that was COVID type symptoms. He said that it seemed like the normal call volume they received for this time of year was a lot lower than it would be. He said they would have to go back and look once this was over, but he felt that for springtime, their call volume was a lot lower than it should be right now. Chris Limpp said they went about three and one-half days without a call earlier last week. Es. Brewer expressed his gratitude for EMS and the professional job they had done when responding to a neighbor's call for assistance. The Judge said one of the things that he had done was to order Chris to redirect his time from being a shift supervisor to emergency management.

3. County Clerk office closure

The County Clerk informed that Court that several counties had closed their offices due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, with Fayette County being the largest. She relayed that 5 out of 6 County Clerk staff members

had sought medical treatment for respiratory symptoms, and one was sent for COVID-19 testing. The sixth employee was a diabetic, making her at a higher risk. After approaching the staff after operating for 2 weeks with limited contact, they had voiced valid concerns about their safety and the safety of their families. The Clerk said that she felt obligated to make the decision to close. Up until this point in time, she said she and the staff had been taking care of vehicle and boat registration renewals via mail in, drop-off box, online or over the phone. They had been processing recordings received via delivery, UPS and FED X drop off, and mailed in. The employees and Clerk had been wearing gloves when handling delivered or mailed in packages, and had been wearing masks when answering the door for deliveries. The Clerk said that they felt that these precautions were just not enough to protect them at this juncture. She said that with the next two weeks possibly being pivotal by all indications of the Surgeon General and others, she and her staff felt it prudent to close completely for the next two weeks. The Clerk said she would be in the office attending to election issues that still remained unresolved. She informed the Court that the PVA had closed their office as well for at least the next two weeks. Esq. J. Moody said that by continuing to collect cardboard, they were endangering the employee's health. He said that they needed to stop picking up the cardboard. The Judge said that they were still getting what was in the bins at various businesses, but they were not going to offices picking up recycling. Esq. J. Moody said that they were still picking up in the bins and that the disease was everywhere and the employees needed to stop handling the cardboard for their health. Esq. Travis said that he wanted to give an update on the Animal Control Officer. He said James was in the position at present and that he and the Judge had taken written applications and that at this time they had decided to leave James in the position until the COVID-19 situation was over at which time they would conduct interviews for the position. The Judge said that what Esq. Travis meant was to leave James in the interim position. The Judge said that he knew that Esq. Travis had been working on the solid waste ordinance and getting it updated. Esq. Travis said that he and Esq. Brewer had gone through the draft and he thought that they had it finalized and other than some typographical errors, it was pretty much ready to go.
