E. Communications from Citizens **3 minute limit**

- 1. Roy Legaspi Mr. Legaspi came before the Court to thank the magistrates for the job they have done so far. He stated that he is disappointed with the budget process and stated that the Court needs to have things in the budget that they know they will need to be purchased instead of going back and making changes and adding items to the budget. He stated that before Ordinance are changes they should go back and look at the original Ordinance to see why it was put in place to begin with. He stated that it isn't right that county residents should not have to pay for levee expenses.
- 2. Steve Hesselbrock Mr. Hesselbrock came before the Court on behalf of the County Board of Elections and said that there is a problem brewing with the voting machines and he said that during the 2019 Primary Election there was one machine destroyed by an electrical fire within the machine and that during the 2018 General Election there was a voting machine that malfunctioned he stated that these problems occurred due to the fact that the temperature & humidity within the election storage area is not regulated properly. He stated that the time is coming when the current voting machines will need to be replaced.

Hi Judge Riley,

Thank you for your interest in our software and services. It was our pleasure to meet you, Karen, and Doug at our offices Tuesday. Feel free to come back anytime.

Attached to this e-mail please find an order form for full, unrestricted software licenses for FiscalBooks 7, FiscalPay 7, and FiscalExpress 5. As the order form indicates, you receive a free fiscal year software support subscription with your license fee payment. If you want to begin using the software in July, we need to get moving on installing all the evaluation (demo) programs so you folks can start getting familiar with the software. As well, we require you to install the demos in order to register the full, unrestricted versions after you pay the license fees. The demos are fully functional; they just quit running after July 31. When we receive your license fee payment, we will email you registration codes to enter into the software, along with instructions on how to register the demo to turn it into a full registered version. Any data you guys enter into the demos will be retained when you register the software. We also need to start looking at how we are going to convert your employees, vendors, and chart of accounts into the databases of our software. I'll be happy to do what I can to convert your information, however, you folks will have to create the xls file for me, as we have no idea how any of your current software works. When we converted Henderson County 2 years ago, I believe they were able to get support from both Redwing and Turning Point to assist with creating xls files of their data. We may also need someone to contact Glenda to see about exporting the chart of accounts out of CBR.

If you want multi-user ("client/server") versions, then you also need to acquire a license for the Advantage Database Server, currently owned by SAP. Advantage is installed as a process on a dedicated Windows file server computer, in order to allow multiple users on your network to connect to the same database on the server. I believe Henderson County paid \$650 for a 5-user license. You can call any of the sales people on this SAP sales contacts page to order a license. There are several salesmen you can call in New York. The current Advantage version is v12, so that is what you want to purchase a license for. For now we think all you need is a 5 user license; you can upgrade to more users in the future if needed. Installing Advantage is very easy and we'll be happy to assist with that after you have downloaded the installer. Or, we'll work with Lewis to do that part; you folks won't have to fool with that.

Also attached is an updated Support Subscription fees price list that clarifies that the calculated support fees are based upon the prior fiscal year (for FiscalBooks, FiscalTax, and FiscalLedger), or the prior calendar year (for FiscalPay and FiscalHR). The support subscription fee for FiscalExpress is a flat fee of (currently) \$3,600. All software support subscription fees are prepaid and are due by 6/30, in order to receive software support and updates for the next fiscal year. Thus, if you want the optional Software Support Subscription for FY 20-21, then these fees must also be budgeted in FY 19-20 because the payment will be due by 6/30/20.

Dear Judge Riley,

Please let this email serve as my letter of resignation, effective immediately, from the Spencer County Ethics Commission. It was an honor to serve on this Commission with Mr. Sullivan, Mr. Drury and attorney Ken Jones as much was accomplished these past two years. Hours of personal time and effort was spent re-writing the old outdated ordinance with its cobbled together and often non-applicable paragraphs and sub-paragraphs. What the commission presented to Fiscal Court for their ultimate approval was clear, concise and relevant to current government standards. Section 11 of the approved ordinance required ALL candidates running for elected office and those appointed to position or office that is approved to obligate the County to contracts or purchases of \$500.00 or more, to file a Financial Disclosure Statement with the Ethics Commission within 7 days of filing for candidacy or 30 days after appointment or position that could obligate the County as noted above. Section 14 of the ordinance states if the completed form is not returned in the stated timely manner, a \$25.00 fine will be imposed and listing of the offenders will be published in the local paper.

This action was necessary since several individuals would consistently not file, or file with incomplete or inaccurate information that would cause the Ethics Commission to meet multiple times for review at unnecessary expense to the taxpayers and the use of County employees to track, mail, phone and otherwise waste time on compliance of such a simple requirement.

The lack of enforcement of this fine by Fiscal Court only encourages continued disregard for the legal and timely filing of the required documents and wastes limited time and resources of our County government. More importantly it wastes the time of civic minded citizens that serve on this board and I no longer wish to be part of this revolving door.



LEASE OF WATERFORD PARK AND SPENCER COUNTY SPORTS ASSOCIATION

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the Spencer County Fiscal Court, Kentucky, (the "County"), John Riley, County Judge Executive, 12 West Main Street, Taylorsville, Kentucky 40071 and the Spencer County Sports Association, (the "SCSA"), Waterford Park, P. O. Box 110, Taylorsville, Kentucky 40071.

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the economic and recreational benefits which will insure to the Spencer County Fiscal Court and its inhabitants, and in further consideration of the mutual promises, terms and conditions set forth herein, the Spencer County Fiscal Court does hereby lease, let and demise unto the Spencer County Sports Association athletic fields located at Waterford Park including the softball and soccer fields, concession stand, bleachers, restrooms and adjoining parking lot (the "premises") on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. This lease shall be for a one (1) year term commencing on April 1, 2019 through March 31, 2020. The "SCSA" shall agree to pay, rent in the amount of \$1.00 per year during the Term of this Lease of one (1) year. This lease only applies during SCSA scheduled games and practice events. Both parties acknowledge that the County maintains full access and use for all other activities at all other times.
- The lease premises are to be utilized for playing soccer and related activities only. No fireworks are to be discharged on or about the leased premises.
 - 3. The County shall provide all utilities to the leased premises.
- 4. The County shall be responsible for all maintenance of the leased premises except that during the seasons of the respective sports for which the SCSA utilizes the premises, the SCSA shall be responsible for the routine maintenance of the playing fields and concession facilities being used.
- 5. During the primary term and any extension or renewal thereof, the SCSA shall at its own expense obtain and maintain in full force and effect general liability insurance coverage of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence from an insurance company acceptable to the County with the County named as an additional insured thereon. The SCSA shall furnish a copy of said insurance policy together with documentation showing payment of the premium due. Failure to maintain said insurance during the lease term shall constitute an act of default giving the County the right to immediately terminate this lease until such insurance is in full force and effect. The SCSA shall also maintain accident insurance on all participants in league activities.
- 6. At the conclusion of the lease and at the end of the season for each sport for which the SCSA utilizes the premises the SCSA shall vacate and surrender possession of the leased premises to the County in substantially the same condition and state of repair as existed upon the commencement of this lease normal wear and tear excepted.

- 7. During the lease term the SCSA shall have the right to charge admission, and sell concessions. The County shall have the right to require the removal of all of the advertising at the conclusion of the lease term or at the end of the season for each sport for which the SCSA utilizes the premises.
- 8. SCSA agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County of and from any and all claims, demands, losses, causes of action, damage, lawsuits, judgments, including attorneys' fees and costs, to the extent caused by or arising out of or relating to the use of the aforesaid athletic field by the SCSA.
- 9. SEVERABILITY: If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof shall, for any reason and to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, neither the remainder of this Agreement nor the application of the provision to other persons, entities or circumstances shall be affected thereby, but instead shall be enforced to the maximum extent permitted by law.
- 10. RENEWAL: This lease agreement is to be automatically renewed at the end of the term for which drawn, until March 2020. Either party may terminate the lease in years subsequent to this 2019-2020 lease, by giving 30 day notice to the other party.

4. Proposal to change employee leave time - no action taken

CHAPTER 5: BENEFITS Section I: Probationary Period

No benefits vest until after ninety (90) day probationary period is completed, although they accrue during the probationary period.

Benefits apply to permanent full-time employees only. Benefits will be based upon date of hire in order to calculate years of service.

Section II: Vacation Time

A. All full-time employees shall be entitled to vacation leave at the following rates:

Years Service	Vacation Tin
First Year	0
Anniversary Date (After first completed year)	40 hours
2 – 7 years	80 hours
8 years and over 8 - 15 years	120 hours
15 years and over	160 hours

- B. Vacation time is based on the anniversary date of hire, and will be awarded for use beginning February 1 of each calendar year. Employees achieving the next level of earned vacation time during the year shall receive additional time on a prorated basis for remainder of that year. Any vacation time accrued by the employee and not used by, nor paid the monetary equivalent to, the employee by December 31st of each year, will be carried forward to the next calendar year. Any employee will be allowed to accumulate and carry over a maximum of 240 vacation hours.

 Due to the change in the year 2019 to the accrual date of vacation time to employee anniversary date of hire, the County Judge Executive may at his discretion allow, on a case by case basis, the granting of vacation time for 2019 prior to the anniversary date so that employees may properly plan for vacations and transition to this policy change.

 Beginning January 1, 2020 all vacation time will be accrued on employees' anniversary date of hire.
- C. The employee must complete a Vacation Leave Request Form and have the request authorized by the Department Head at least thirty days prior to using vacation leave. Exceptions can be made at the Department Head's discretion.
- D. No employee will be permitted to take advance leave or leave that has not been earned. Vacation pay shall be at full rate at the current wage.
- E. An employee who has at least one (1) full year and whose employment is terminated during the succeeding year is entitled to full vacation for the year worked.
- F. An employee who is terminated shall be paid for all accumulated vacation leave, excluding probationary employees.
- G. The County Treasurer and/or the finance officer shall keep complete records of vacation leave. An employee fraudulently obtaining vacation leave or a department head falsely

certifying vacation leave allowance may be suspended or dismissed, or subject to further legal action.

- H. Vacation time shall continue to accrue while an employee is absent from work due to a workers' compensation covered injury or illness.
- I. All accrued vacation time and personal time must be exhausted before any employee can request time off without pay if they do not meet the eligibility requirements for Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA) leave. Unpaid leave time is to be approved at the discretion of the Department Head.

Section III: Sick /Personal Time

- A. After first year, anniversary date of hire, full-time employees will be given six (6) sick days. On February 1 of each calendar year, full-time employees will be given six (6) sick days. These sick days can be taken anytime during the calendar year upon the approval from their supervisor. Anytime an employee is absent from work two consecutive days, a doctor's note will be required. Up to 500 sick hours may accumulate and be carried forward into the next calendar year. Upon termination for any reason an employee forfeits all hours of sick time. All full-time and part-time employees of the County will be entitled to take leave from work without pay for illness and sickness of themselves or dependent children and/or family. The employee may be required to take extended leave without pay, for up to twelve (12) weeks under the provisions of the Family Medical Leave Act.
- B. After first year, anniversary date of hire, full-time employees will receive six

 (6) personal days. On February 1 of each calendar year, full-time employees will be given six (6) personal days. These personal days can be taken anytime during the calendar year upon the approval from their supervisor. Request for use of the personal days shall be submitted to the supervisor on a Vacation Request Form with the designation "Personal Days" on it. These personal days may accumulate and be carried forward into the next calendar year. However, no employee may have more than 12 personal days accumulated at any given time. Days accumulated over 12 will be forfeited by the employee. paid monetarily to the employee. Upon termination for any reason an employee shall be paid for accumulated personal leave, excluding probationary employees.
 - C. All accrued sick time must be exhausted before any employee can request time off without pay if they do not meet the eligibility requirements for Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA) leave. Unpaid leave time is to be approved at the discretion of the Department Head.
 - D. Sick leave shall continue to accrue while an employee is absent from work due to a workers' compensation covered injury or illness.
 - E If the employee cannot perform his/her current job and is limited to restricted duty and there is no restricted duty available, the employee shall use his/her sick leave or vacation time during the period he/she is absent. If the employee has no accrued sick leave or vacation time, he/she will be on unpaid leave.
 - F. Employees who, following termination, are reemployed by the County, shall not have any former sick leave restored to their sick leave accounts.

The health department will provide these clinical services according to the Immunization section of the Core Clinical Service Guide.

The health department will provide adult hepatitis B vaccinations, hepatitis A vaccinations and TB Skin Tests to persons identified by the first party needing this service for employment.
